The bill expands the behavioral health-care continuum gap grant program to include awarding a community investment grant for a new capital construction project.

10	trauma recovery, trauma-informed training, training on providing services				
11	in a culturally responsive manner, transitional housing, supportive

15	EVIDENCE-BASED OR EVIDENCE-INFORMED services, which may include

9	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly finds,
10	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
11	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for
12	the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
