Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating \$2,516,451

JBC Staff Fiscal Analysis 1

General Fund to the Department of Education for FY 2022-23. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 2.4 FTE. The amendment also provides an appropriation of \$30,000 cash funds from the P.O.S.T Board Cash Fund to the Department of Law for FY 2022-23.

L.006 and J.002

Bill Sponsor amendment **L.006** (attached) modifies the requirement in the bill to appropriate money for the Expelled and At-risk Student Services Grant Program, so that only \$500,000 is required to be appropriated for FY 2022-23, rather than \$2,000,000.

Amendment **J.002** (attached) includes the same provisions as amendment J.001, except that the appropriation for the Expelled and At-risk Student Services Grant Program is reduced to \$500,000. This amendment provides a total appropriation for the Department of Education of \$1,016,451 General Fund and an appropriation for the Department of Law of \$30,000 cash funds for FY 2022-23.

The Committee may adopt J.001 or the combination of L.006 and J.002, but should not adopt any other combination.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2022-23 based on the March 2022 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package includes two set-asides:

- \$40.0 million General Fund for bills that create ongoing obligations; and
- \$900.0 million General Fund for bills that create one-time obligations in FY 2022-23.

The \$40.0 million *appropriations* set-aside includes an additional \$6.0 million General Fund to provide a 15.0 percent General Fund reserve for those appropriations. The \$900.0 million *obligations* set-aside does not include an additional amount for a General Fund reserve and, assumes, but does not require, that obligations be addressed through statutory transfers rather than appropriations. Therefore *appropriations* from the \$900.0 million set-aside require an additional 15.0 percent to maintain the statutory General Fund reserve.

This bill creates an ongoing obligation and requires a General Fund appropriation of \$247,394 for FY 2022-23, reducing the \$40.0 million set aside by the same amount. This bill also creates a one-time obligation and requires a General Fund appropriation of \$2,269,057 for FY 2022-23 in addition to the ongoing obligation described above, reducing the \$900.0 million set aside by \$2,609,416 in order to maintain a 15.0 percent statutory General Fund reserve. If sponsor amendments L.006/J.002 are adopted, the bill will require a one-time obligation of \$769,057, in addition to the ongoing obligation described above, reducing the \$900.0 million set aside by \$884,416 in order to maintain a 15.0 percent statutory General Fund reserve.
