(d) EXCEPT FOR THE HOUSE WORKPLACE HARASSMENT COMMITTEE,		
	from the members appointed to each committee specified in		
	SUBSECTIONS (a) and (b) above OF THIS RULE, the Speaker shall		
	designate the chairman and the vice-chairman of each committee		

- 1 (f.5) (1) THE HOUSE WORKPLACE HARASSMENT COMMITTEE SHALL 2 HANDLE COMPLAINTS UNDER THE WORKPLACE 3 HARASSMENT POLICY OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY 4 AGAINST A MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 5 OR A PARTISAN STAFF PERSON OF THE HOUSE OF 6 REPRESENTATIVES. THE HOUSE WORKPLACE HARASSMENT 7 COMMITTEE CONSISTS OF SIX MEMBERS, THREE APPOINTED 8 BY THE SPEAKER AND THREE APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY 9 LEADER. MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE WORKPLACE 10 HARASSMENT COMMITTEE SHOULD HAVE THE APPROPRIATE 11 EXPERIENCE AND DEMEANOR TO HANDLE POTENTIALLY 12 PARTISAN ISSUES IN AN OBJECTIVE MANNER.
- 13 (2) THE HOUSE WORKPLACE HARASSMENT COMMITTEE SHALL 14 ELECT A CHAIR AND A VICE-CHAIR, ONE FROM EACH OF THE 15 TWO MAJOR POLITICAL PARTIES. THE CHAIR SO ELECTED 16 SERVES AS CHAIR FOR THE FIRST REGULAR SESSION OF THE 17 GENERAL ASSEMBLY AT WHICH THE HOUSE WORKPLACE 18 HARASSMENT COMMITTEE IS TO SERVE AND AS VICE-CHAIR 19 FOR THE SECOND REGULAR SESSION. THE VICE-CHAIR SO 20 ELECTED SERVES AS CHAIR FOR THE SECOND REGULAR 21 SESSION OF SAID GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

- (3) IF THE CHAIR RECEIVES A COMPLAINT AGAINST A MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OR A PARTISAN STAFF PERSON OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES UNDER THE WORKPLACE HARASSMENT POLICY, THE CHAIR SHALL CONVENE A MEETING OF THE HOUSE WORKPLACE HARASSMENT COMMITTEE TO CONSIDER THE COMPLAINT AND SHALL PROCEED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE WORKPLACE HARASSMENT POLICY. PURSUANT TO THE WORKPLACE HARASSMENT POLICY AND SECTION 24-6-402 (3)(a)(III), COLORADO REVISED STATUTES, MEETINGS OF THE HOUSE WORKPLACE HARASSMENT COMMITTEE MAY OCCUR IN EXECUTIVE SESSION. ADDITIONALLY, PURSUANT TO SECTION 24-72-204 (3)(a)(X.5), COLORADO REVISED STATUTES, ALL DOCUMENTS RELATED TO ANY COMPLAINT ARE CONFIDENTIAL AND ARE NOT SUBJECT TO PUBLIC INSPECTION.
