## Words From Pastor Julia

Dear friends in Christ-

For from the least to the greatest of them, everyone is greedy for unjust gain; and from prophet to priest, everyone deals falsely. They have treated the wound of my people carelessly, saying, "Peace, peace," when there is no peace. They acted shamefully; they committed abomination, yet they were not ashamed; they did not know how to blush. - Jeremiah 6:13-15

Often when we speak of peace and the Bible together, we speak of the peace of Christ being in our hearts and minds. This is a real and valid peace, one that Jesus spoke about and prayed for his disciples to have. This is not, however, the only biblical concept of peace.

The Bible speaks about the peace of the land, of the ending of strife between people and governments (nations), and the peace that passes all understanding. The blessed peacemakers who shall be called children of God (Matthew 5:9) are not simply the people who strive to help others feel good, but the people who give their whole selves to pursuing the well-being, safety, and holy flourishing of all.

When our conversations turn to peace or peacemaking, it is often treated like a pipe dream or something that can only be accomplished by force. Yet all of human history shows us that use of the sword, so to speak, begets use of the sword. In a time of war or threat of war, we who think of ourselves as followers of Christ need to ask ourselves some very serious questions. How many lost innocent lives are an acceptable number? How much collateral damage is just "inevitable"? How do we know who is "right"?

These are complicated questions with complex and incomplete answers. On this side of the life to come, there is no perfection, but that doesn't mean that there is not a necessary striving to imitate Christ in every area of our lives. When I sing, "I want to be like Jesus in my heart"- where does it stop? How can I sing those words, but put parameters on the peace I am called to pray for and pursue?

Let us live together in prayer- in both word and deed- that God's peace may indeed come to the whole creation and that it may begin in us.

## Thursday, 19 June 2025

**Present:** Kelli Brewer, Rusty Terland, Becky Frese, Debbie Buerkle, Pastor Julia Seymour, Meggen Whalin, Lori Minette, Judy Riter. **Not Present:** Jeni Lannen, Pat Leary, Einar Stene

**Council Meeting Minutes:** Becky moved to approve May 15 minutes as corrected. Meggen seconded the motion, followed by unanimous approval.

**Examples of Fulfilling Our Mission:** Family Fun Night and VBS held and successful. Hosted the joint Breakfast Church Service. Rusty and Pastor Julia attended Synod Assembly.

**Treasurer's Report:** Debbie reported that the Servant Keeper program may have limited time left based on problems she has encountered. She requested that a council member be familiar with her duties as treasurer. This request will be addressed. It was noted that giving is down. Rusty moved to approve the treasurer's report with second by Becky. Unanimous approval.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Julia will be away June 22-27 serving Flathead Bible Camp. She is in the process of seeking pulpit supply for August 3.

**Music and Worship:** No recent meeting but noted that Cali Rooney will lead choir this summer. **Education:** We have two campers planning to attend camp at Christikon. Members of the Bible Book Club plan to meet during the summer. VBS has been successful this week with fewer helpers. Pastor Julia shared, "there's a difference between having VBS and Making it happen." More volunteers will be needed for 2026.

**Mission:** Committee members approved \$250 purchase of books for Flathead and Christikon Camps via email. Judy moved to approve the email action, seconded by Kelli. Unanimous approval. **Property:** Rusty has contacted G&J Enterprise seeking a bid for a lift and is waiting for a response. He is also seeking a roofer to address the leak in the entry area. Dan Myrstol has the kneeling rail upholstery project on his list for fall. Pat Leary, Rob and Daniel Seymour, and Ron Riter installed the air conditioning units.

**WELCA:** Women's Retreat set for August 23, 2025.

President's Correspondence: Lori shared a thank you from the PMC staff and residents.

Old Business: Pastor Julia and Rusty attended Synod Assembly as delegates and reported Pastor Ben Quanbeck was elected Bishop. His installation is in September. Thirty-five attended Family Fun Night. "Christmas in June" VBS was successful. The June 8 joint Breakfast Church Service was attended by approximately ninety. The Episcopal Church will host the October service. We are on Benchmark Masonry's 2026 schedule. \$111,000 is needed to begin. A special congregation meeting to address the masonry repairs will be scheduled for the second or third Sunday in September at July council meeting. Some endowment money is available for repairs, lift and/or carpet expenses. Council members are asked to seek funding possibilities (grant, fundraisers, etc.) prior to July meeting and to notify via email council members of possibilities to avoid overlapping requests.
