# <u>Words From Pastor Julia</u>

Dear Friends in Christ-

"But we had hoped..." - Luke 24:21a

It is extremely rare for me to take a tiny part of a verse out of context to apply to any situation. If you know me at all, I'm as likely to use a whole chapter than one verse. Nevertheless, this verse fragment from the end of Luke is one I've turned in my mind, especially recently.

In situ, these words come in the dialogue on the road to Emmaus. Cleopas and his friend meet a stranger on the road and, in explaining all that had happened with Jesus' crucifixion and death, Cleopas speaks of the hope they had held about who Jesus was for them and for the world. We had hoped...

As people who know the truth of the resurrection already, from our historical viewpoint, we see the irony of these words. The fulfilled hope of the followers of Christ is on the road with them! They couldn't, however, see that amidst their grief, fear, anger, and trauma.

As I said, I think about this phrase all the time because I wonder what I am missing when I am stuck in my unfulfilled hopes. Am I unable to see the truth about another personwhether positive or negative? Am I thwarted in perceiving a creative solution to a problem? Am I grinding my gears about a matter of justice, instead of pursing what I can do to help a situation? Do I keep rehashing a thing over and over instead of taking it to the Lord in prayer?

This can happen to any of us, at any time, regarding any kind of situation.

In particular, it would be easy for this to become our mindset as we face a huge need for repairing and refurbishing our church home. We could get stuck in what we hoped for-including that this would never need to be tackled, that it would fall in someone else's lap, or even that Jesus will return before we need to solve the problem. Stuck hope becomes blindness, preventing us from seeing how Christ is among us and will help us in the situation. What we hadhoped is very real, but we are here now. What we definitely do not want is to miss the power of resurrection in us, around us, and compelling us in God's future for us.

The next months and years will take significant faithful action, which will only be possible when we are able to release what "we had hoped".

# **BTLC Council Meeting Minutes**

## Thursday, 10 July 2025

**Present:** Lori Minette, Rusty Terland, Debbie Buerkle, Meggen Whalin, Kelli Brewer, Becky Frese, Pastor Julia Seymour, Einar Stene, Judy Riter, Al Buerkle **Not Present:** Jeni Lannen, Pat Leary

President Lori Minette called the meeting to order at 6:05 PM. Pastor Julia led the devotion.

Minutes: Minutes of the June 19, 2025 meeting were unanimously approved.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS** 

**Endowment:** Al Buerkle gave the Endowment Committee report regarding money available to use for capital improvements. Report on file.

**Examples of Fulfilling our Mission:** Pastor Julia and group of girls attended Flathead Camp.

**Treasurer's Report:** Debbie informed council that there will be expenditures for a new vacuum and refrigerator next month. She reported that we'll need to file taxes on rental house income this year. She will seek an accountant familiar with taxes concerning non-profits organizations. Becky moved to approve report with second by Meggen. Unanimous approval.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Julia will be gone July 28 thru August 9 (4 days vacation, 6 days continuing education). Eric Olsen has agreed to fill the pulpit on August 3.

**Music and Worship:** Choir will participate in service on July 27<sup>th</sup>.

Education: Pastor Julia is working on fall Bible studies and dates for confirmation.

**Mission:** Their committee recommended sending benevolence funds in the amount of \$1765.00 to Community Foundation of Texas Hill Country for assistance following the recent flood. Meggen moved to approve this expenditure with second by Kelli. Unanimous approval.

**Property:** Debbie reported that the reupholstery of kneeling rail and two chairs is on Dan Myrstol's list. A committee will select the color from Dan's options. It was suggested that we get an estimate for sanctuary carpet from Central Lumber in Harlowton. The committee will look into this. Pastor Julia reported that parsonage sprinkler system has yet to be repaired since it was damaged during street work. Rusty reported that he has not heard from G&J Enterprises concerning bid on handicap lift. Rusty also reported that Jason Palm has looked at the church roof with recommendations for repair and will give an estimate of cost.

**WELCA:** Report read and is on file. **President's Correspondence:** None

**Old Business:** Discussed Benchmark Masonry's estimate of \$111,000 first phase of sanctuary repair concerning buttresses and grout. This estimate is on file. A motion was made by Einar to hold special congregational meeting on September 7 to vote on sanctuary repairs. Meggen seconded the motion. Unanimous approval.

**New Business:** Discussed possible grants available to help pay for sanctuary repairs. The final business was the reading of office administrator, Dawn Rudolph's resignation. Meggen moved to accept, with second by Rusty. Unanimous approval. Pastor Julia and Meggen will write job description to advertise for replacement offering \$15/hour for 10 to 15 hours weekly. Judy will be contact person for applicants.

Having no further business, the meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer at 8:30 PM. Our next meeting will be August 14 at 6 PM. Lori Minette will lead devotions.


