Words From Pastor Julia

Dear Friends in Christ-

As they were going along the road, someone said to him, "I will follow you wherever you go." And Jesus said to him, "Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head." - Luke 9:57-59

Since the very beginning of people following Jesus, there have been tensions about the "right" way to do things. Those differences have resulted in rifts, unexpected partnerships, failed experiments, and much successful work through the help of the Spirit. The most common tension we face in our own time is the delicate balance between maintenance and mission. This pull is evident in many areas- how we spend money, which activities we prioritize, and even how you want me to spend my time on your behalf.

Maintaining the balance can be difficult, but it is imperative for the life of the church. We are living in an era when a faithful community typically has regular activities in a maintained space, which they usually own, and occasional outreach activities in the community or through financial support.

We are an inflection point in the life of our congregation. We are successfully engaged, thanks be to God, in supportive and fruitful mission work in our community and beyond. The time has also come to undergo some maintenance of our church home. On September 7, we are going to begin the conversation about the potential scope of that work and how it might happen. We're talking about several projects that could happen over a span of years, paid for through a variety of sources, including grants.

We cannot ignore needed maintenance any more than we could choose to not fulfill our mission. Our church home has been a shelter and support for the faithful in this community for nearly 120 years. It is part of our work together to maintain it for the glory of God for another 120, Lord willing.

The appearance, preservation, and accessibility of our church home is important and it's not a conversation that we can put off any longer. I pray that we can all enter this conversation with open minds and hearts. I trust that we are committed together to the work of mission and maintenance in this place, at this time, for Christ's sake.

BTLC Council Meeting Minutes

Thursday, 14 August 2025

Present: Kelli Brewer, Becky Frese, Lori Minette, Rusty Terland, Pat Leary, Meggen Whalin, Pastor Julia Seymour, Debbie Buerkle, Judy Riter, Einar Stene, Jeni Lannen

President Lori Minette called the meeting to order at 6 pm with all council members in attendance and led devotions.

Minutes: The minutes of the July 10, 2025 meeting were unanimously approved.

Examples of Fulfilling Our Mission: Our church has remained open for use by our community members.

Treasurer's Report: Debbie informed the council that she has contacted Katie Gentry concerning assisting with preparation of our taxes and Katie agreed to meet with Debbie in September. Treasurer's financial report was moved for approval by Becky, seconded by Meggen. Unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Julia expressed her thanks for the recent time off and said she will be meeting with new administrative assistant to review job duties and have work agreement signed. Current administrative assistant's final day of work is August 22. The incoming new bishop, Pastor Ben Quanbeck, will be installed on September 20, 2025.

Music and Worship: Next joint service is scheduled to be hosted by the Episcopal Church on September 21 at the fairgrounds with a pet blessing.

Education: Bible study will resume on September 8 studying the first part of Genesis. Book club will resume in September with date to be announced. Online confirmation class will be on Sunday evenings with three students expected, while in person class of seven will begin meeting in October.

Mission: Debbie shared information about the financial problems of the Tumbleweed Program for Youth we support. It was suggested we promote donations through the congregation. Mission committee will meet following the August 17 worship service.

Property: Rusty reported he's waiting for roof repairs estimate from Jason Palm. G and J Enterprises submitted an estimate of \$48,308 for a handicap lift that would be located under the porch roof of the Parish Hall. Discussion held concerning masonry project and consensus of council was to see if repair of cracks in buttresses could be done in stages. Al Buerkle and Rusty Terland will lead the discussion at the special congregational meeting on September 7 following worship. Potential repairs of the church building will be the discussion focus with a potential Projects Committee consisting of council, property and congregation members to be organized. Rusty stated that the city has paid for the damage to parsonage sprinkler system that occurred during street reconstruction.

WELCA: The Ladies Retreat led by Pastor will be about prayer and held at Duffey's on August 23. Fall Bazaar is tentatively scheduled for October 23, 2025.

President's Correspondence: None

Old Business: Motion made by Pat, seconded by Rusty to hire Brannin Tyler as administrative assistant. Pastor Julia will email job description to executive committee for approval before having Brannin sign it. Also set Brannin up with a debit card to be a signer for the checking account. Brannin will be working 10-12 hours weekly at \$16.50 per hour with raise after six months of work. Debbie will secure appropriate farewell gift for out-going administrative assistant.

New Business: Pastor Julia and Lori plan to attend the grant writing workshop on September 24 at the library.

Having no further business, meeting adjourned and closed with the Lord's Prayer at 7:30 pm.

Our next meeting will be on September 11 at 6 pm. Kelli Brewer will lead devotions.
