

Words from Pastor Julia

Dear Friends in Christ-

May your unfailing love be with us, Lord, even as we put our hope in you. - Psalm 33:22

On the day I am writing this, it has been 75 days since we learned about Victoria's brain tumor. In that time, she has had four MRIs, 2 CAT scans, a brain surgery, uncounted blood draws, and now 6 completed sessions of radiation with 24 more to go. To say that it has been a lot is an understatement. We had no idea what we didn't know in terms of having a child (or any family member) in need of intensive medical intervention.

It is a blessing that Victoria has, so far, been able to maintain her good spirits and joyful sparkle. It is a blessing that Daniel has been able to have most of his own normal activities, including baseball, swimming lessons, and summer camp. It is a blessing that Rob and I have been able to keep putting one foot in front of the other.

Thus, when people ask, "How are you doing"- it is harder than you might think to answer that question. With so many blessings and so much support, should I truthfully answer, "Not great"? Even with great trust in God and great evidence of excellent medical care, I am still worried for my baby, concerned about her future health, and grieved for everyone who has this experience, but might not have the resources we do. I hope in the Lord with all my being and yet I am not able to plan too far out because I only have energy for one day at a time right now.

Living this way is complicated and complex. As Christians, we often try to simplify things by saying to "let go and let God" or "if you're going to pray, don't worry". Life here, however, is not that simple. It is possible to trust in God and yet have anxiety. It is completely normal to put one's hope in the Lord and yet lament the loss of control one feels in trauma and pain. All of these things are real. Furthermore, these are real situations in which Christ walks with us and the Spirit helps us.

We must be careful with one another not to offer quick platitudes or simplifying statements that ignore or diminish one another's pain. Our walk together as a faith community includes holding one another up and respecting the truths of our diverse experiences. This means that sometimes we have to admit to one another and accept from each other struggles and pain alongside faith and hope.


I cannot fully express my family's deep gratitude for all the support we have received during this present struggle. Your great faithfulness has been a tangible sign of God's presence in these 75 days. Even so, your love when I say that things are tough means more than you can know. Let us continue to show that love to one another and to the world.

Vice President Natalie Rosebrock called the meeting to order. Ken Nelson led devotions.

Examples of fulfilling our Mission:

Graduation. Resumed coffee hour after worship. Resumed communion in the sanctuary Singing during worship. Special Music with Ken and Ethel Nelson, Ryan Christensen and Tom Still **Council Meeting Minutes:** Pastor Julia pointed out in the May Minutes under Examples of fulfilling our Mission that it should have read: Jim Bratvold, Ken Nelson and Les Schiele who helped the supply pastors rather than interim pastors. Barb Terland moved to approve the Minutes from the May 13th meeting as corrected and Ken Nelson the Motion. The Minutes were approved as amended.

Treasurer's Report: Becky Laverell moved to accept the Treasurer's Report for May and Barb Terland seconded the Motion. The Treasurer's Report was approved.

Committee Reports:

It was decided that whenever the piano needs to be moved, it will need to be supervised by someone in the congregation to make sure the brake is released prior to moving the piano. Discussion on replacing the carpet in the sanctuary will be tabled for the next meeting.

WELCA: WELCA met on June 4th. Carol Walla and Les Schiele are on the Alter Committee fo June.

President's Correspondence: Nothing to review at this time.

New Business:

4th of July Service: Pastor Julia will write something for the sermon to be read in her absence. Deb Silverstein volunteered to read the sermon. Ken will sing "America the Beautiful". **Job Descriptions:** Job descriptions were reviewed and accepted with a few minor typo corrections.

He has also been deeply involved in California legislation and regulation regarding clean energy and has been called on by the California Public Utilities Commission, California Energy Commission, and the Legislature to provide expert testimony on a wide range of clean energy issues
- Pr. Jessica Crist The Doctrine of Discovery How Rick Santorum (and just about everyone else) Got it All Wrong. Jessica has degrees from Yale and Harvard and is the former Bishop of the Montana Synod. She coordinated the ELCA's commemoration of the women's ordination anniversaries and currently co-chairs the ELCA's Task Force implementing the 2016 repudiation of the doctrine of discovery. She has been an advocate for Native American issues.
- Pr. Mark Gravrock The Reign of the Gathering God: The Gospel of Mark for 2021 Mark is a teacher and pastor, and has found the same vital center of joy in each setting of ministry: the place where the living word of God intersects with real, concrete daily life. He has taught Bible, Greek, and Christian spirituality for 22 years at Trinity Lutheran College in Washington.

To: Campers/Guests registered for Christikon in 2021 Fr: Pastor Mark Re: Camp Preparation & Travel

We're thankful for the progress made in the Covid fight, that we know much more about how it spreads than we did last season, and that all staff received vaccine before arriving for the summer. While we aren't fully back to "normal" conditions, vaccines are widely available for anyone 12 and up in most, if not all, areas of the country. We continue to strongly encourage everyone who can to get the shot before coming to camp. In consultation with our camp physician and county health director, this is the latest update regarding Covid 19:

Guest/Group Preparation and Travel:

- · Quarantine unnecessary if all group members fully vaccinated
- For those not vaccinated, we ask them to limit outside contact in the 10 days prior to leaving for Christikon
 - We suggest groups limit contact while in route (i.e. rest stops over convenience stores, ordering food to overnight lodging rather than eating out, etc.). Again for groups fully vaccinated, they can travel more freely

While at Christikon, some protocols remain:

- hand washing/sanitizing stations in place before each meal
- cabin bunks remain further apart and all cabins equipped with ventilation fans
 - most activities and programming done outdoors
 - · all will mask when singing at worship
- we'll continue limited our practice of joining hands during meal and worship prayer

Remember to pray for the staff and campers.
