


Big Sky Fire Dept. Incident Call Volume

Total Single Family Equivalents (SFEs) Connected








Big Sky Real Estate Total Units Sold





Community Projects: Tiger Grant Update



- 1 BIG SKY RESORT ROAD
 Construction of a left-turn lane and related improvements at Big Sky Resort Road.
- CURVE WARNING SIGNAGE UPGRADES
 Installation of curve warning signage upgrades
 between Big Sky Resort Road and Andesite Road.
- 3 ANDESITE ROAD TO BIG PINE DRIVE
 Construction of left-turn lanes at Andesite Road and
 Big Pine Drive.
- 4 ANDESITE ROAD TO BIG PINE DRIVE SHARED-USE PATH
 Construction of a paved shared-use pathway along MT
 64 from Andesite Road to Big Pine Drive.
- 5 HUNTLEY DRIVE
 Construction of a left-turn lane and related improvements at Huntley Drive.

- 6 LITTLE COYOTE ROAD PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE
 Construction of a pedestrian bridge along Little
 Coyote Road over West Fork Gallatin River
 adjacent to the Big Sky Community Park.
- 7 LITTLE COYOTE ROAD PATHWAY
 Construction of a paved shared-use pathway along
 Little Coyote Road from MT 64 to the Big Sky
 Community Park.
- 8 LITTLE COYOTE ROAD
 Construction of a traffic signal, left and right-turn lanes at Little Coyote Road, and a left-turn lane at Meadow Village Drive.
- LITTLE COYOTE ROAD PEDESTRIAN TUNNEL
 Construction of a pedestrian tunnel under
 MT 64 west of Little Coyote Road and related
 improvements.
- 10 WILDLIFE CROSSING SIGNAGE UPGRADES Installation of wildlife crossing signage upgrades west of US 191.
 - US 191 AREA
 Elimination of gravel shoulder parking by extending existing curb and gutter, installation of paved bus pull-outs, and installation of paved pull-outs for wildlife viewing.

- Roadway & intersection improvements at US 191 & Big Sky Resort

Community Projects: Tiger Grant Update



CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE

We expect to complete most of the work this year, wrapping up in early November. Crews will return in 2024 to complete chip seal activities and final pavement markings.



Mid May

Work begins with the Little Coyote Road pedestrian bridge. Construction at several project locations occurs simultaneously.

Late May

Construction begins on the Little
Coyote pedestrian tunnel, left-turn
lanes at Andesite Road and Big Pine
Drive, and the shared-use path from
Andesite Road to Big Pine Drive.



Mid July

Traffic signal installation at Little Coyote Road is expected to get underway.

Late July

Updates to the US 191 intersection area are scheduled from late July through September.



Late August-September

Pathway construction at Little Coyote Road.

Construction of the left-turn lane at Huntley.



Late September

Construction begins on the left-turn lane at Big Sky Resort Road.

Paving of most project areas.


Parking Expansions & Carpooling Priorities




- Made adjustments to parking systems Winter 22/23 and saw success

100% CLEAN ELECTRICITY

An important step in reaching our net zero carbon emissions goal is to power our resort with 100 percent clean electric energy.







FOREVERPROJECT

- · 2008 2018
 - Formed first internal Green Team
 - Upgraded building HVAC systems and installed hotel room thermostats with occupancy sensors
 - Began transitioning lighting fixtures to LEDs
 - Hosted annual mountain clean ups and completed habitat restoration projects with community partners
- 2019 2020
 - Signed onto the NSAA Climate Challenge
 - Piloted a composting program in Vista Hall with YES Compost
 - Purchased RECs to operate chairlifts on 100% clean energy
 - Partnered with Tradewater to allow guests to offset their trip
- 2021
 - Achieved 100% clean electricity commitment
 - Signed the Mountain Collaborative for Climate Action
 - Completed stream restoration project w/ Gallatin River Task Force
 - Implemented a No Idling Policy
- · 2022
 - Wrote advocacy guest column: Congress needs to act on climate
 - Reduced water usage in Huntley by 22% with fixture upgrades
 - Expanded composting to all F&B outlets, diverting 20+ tons
- · 2023
 - Earned NSAA Sustainable Slopes Transportation Badge
 - Installed 32 kW net-metered solar PV array on Levinski Lodge
 - Published our ForeverProject 2030 Master Plan
 - Awarded the Community & Partnerships Golden Eagle Award

- Skier convenience: NEW lower terminal location








Two Stage Gondola
