What are you seeking? In Psalm 24, David encourages us to seek the Lord, even if we already feel that we've found him. How do we go about doing so? The poetry of the psalm recommends two approaches.

Discussion Questions:

1. What does it mean to you that if you believe in Christ, he has purified your heart so that you can enter the presence of God (Hebrews 1:3, 9:13; Titus 2:14)?
2. What is your reaction to these words from the poet Christian Wiman? "We are driven ceaselessly onward in this life and are certain of our desires only until we realize them, at which point they seem to dissolve and shimmer farther off, like a heat mirage on a road down which we can't stop racing."
3. How would you describe your disposition to seek God, even the face of God—that is, the essence of who he is?
4. How do you think you might go about ascending "the hill of the Lord" to seek his presence?
5. How do you think you might go about opening the gates of your heart to Jesus, the King of glory?
6. How else do you think you might go about seeking God?
