Discussion Questions:

1. In Luke 9:1-2, Jesus sends his disciples out to minister in the same way that he has been ministering. How have you sensed God's call for you to join him in his mission? How have you tried to respond to that call?
2. Jesus tells the disciples to "take nothing for the journey" (Luke 9:3). Why do you think dependence is such an important part of discipleship?
3. When the disciples see the hungry crowd, their first response is, "Send them away," but Jesus responds, "You give them something to eat" (Luke 9:12-13). Where do you see a need around you that feels too big for what you have to offer?
4. Jesus takes the disciples' five loaves and two fish, blesses them, and multiplies them. What does this story teach us about the difference between offering Jesus what we have versus waiting until we feel like we have enough?
5. The story ends with abundance—everyone is satisfied, and there are twelve baskets left over (Luke 9:17). How have you experienced God providing what you needed as you followed him? How might remembering his provision give you courage for the mission ahead?
