
Txwy A – 400' \$14.5 million






Txwy A – 300' \$10.6 million




Txwy A – 321' \$10.9 million




Txwy A – 400'-321' \$11.1 million


MAINTAIN EXISTING RUNWAY WIDTH

- Footnote 12 of Table 3-5, Runway Design, in FAA AC 5300-13A, the required runway width is 100 feet for aircraft having a maximum certificated takeoff weight of 150,000 lbs or less.
- Airport critical aircraft is the GV with an MTOW of 91,000 lbs, 100 foot width would be recommended.

RECOMMENDATION

The Airport Advisory Board recommend Draft Phasing Plan Update, which includes separating the Parallel Taxiways to 400' to meet Group III Aircraft Standards, and maintain the runway width at the existing 100' width as recommended for the airport's G-V critical aircraft and recommend the Airport Consultant develop the Airport Layout Plan Set based on the same.



B. NOISE ABATEMENT REVIEW

- 1. FAA requires airport open all hours to all aircraft.
- 2. 2015 Airport Noise Footprint is smaller than 2006
- 3. Continue effort to reduce footprint further
- Identify Potential Noise Abatement Corridors
- RNAV Departure and Arrival Curved Procedures
- Implemented NBAA Noise Abatement Procedures for March 1, 2017 publication:
 - Turbine/Jet aircraft operators are requested to use NBAA "Noise Abatement Program" procedures or comparable procedures of aircraft manufacturer.




NOISE ABATEMENT CORRIDORS


