





City of Powder Springs Project Highlights – Bridge Over Silver Comet Trail

- Scope: Removal of bridge over the Silver Comet Trail at Powder Springs Road, and replacement of the bridge with a tunnel to accommodate bicycle and pedestrian traffic on the Silver Comet Trail.
- Project completed April 2014
- Total project cost: \$1,022,226



City of Powder Springs Project Highlights – Hopkins Road Bridge Replacement Joint project with Cobb County

- Scope: Replacing the bridge over Wild Horse Creek on Hopkins Road
- Project completed in 2013



City of Powder Springs Project Highlights – Bridge Rehabilitation

- Bridge rehabilitation projects:
 - Brownsville Road over Powder Springs Creek
 - Dallas Powder Springs Road over Lucille Creek
 - Dallas Powder Springs Road over Powder Springs Creek
 - Macedonia Road over Wild Horse Creek
 - Sweetwater Avenue over Powder Springs Creek
- Total project cost: \$701,009





City of Powder Springs Project Highlights – Computers and Video Equipment for Police Vehicles

- Total project cost: \$251,771
- Projects were completed in 2012



City of Powder Springs Project Highlights – Powder Springs Park

- Joint project with Cobb County and will include concessions, parking, and field improvements in the park, as well as the relocation of the pool to the Wild Horse Creek Park on Macedonia Road.
- This project is scheduled to begin construction this fall.



City of Powder Springs Project Highlights – Linear Park IV Trails, Restroom and Playground

- Project consists of the construction of walking trails, sidewalks, restroom/concession facility and a playground at the Powder Springs Linear Park, located on Richard Sailors Parkway.
- Final project for the 2005 SPLOST Program and was completed this month.



City of Powder Springs Project Highlights – Resurfacing

- Resurfacing budget: approximately \$2.3 million
- Two contracts for total of approximately \$1.1 million included 4 major roads
 - First contract: \$329,000 awarded March 2014
 - Second contract: \$875,000 awarded July 2014
- Both contracts have been completed

City of Powder Springs Project Highlights – Sidewalks

- Sidewalk budget: approximately \$1.3 million
- The project consists of curb and gutter and sidewalk on Lindley Circle, Sharon Drive, Park Drive, Brownsville Road, Louise Street and Preston Place.
- These projects have been designed and construction is scheduled to begin October 2015.

City of Powder Springs Project Highlights Warren Farm Road Sidewalks

- Scope: Construction of curb and gutter and sidewalks along Warren Farm Road to connect residential subdivisions with the Silver Comet Trail.
- Project was completed April 2013
- Total project cost: \$296,418




To date during 2014, SPLOST dollars of \$3.46M have allowed Cobb County Property Management to complete:

- More than 85% of Cobb's streets will have been resurfaced, giving Cobb arguably the best maintained roads in the region/state. This investment protects our infrastructure, provides for smooth travel, and enhances the safety of our roads.
- Replacing over 80 bridges, providing Cobb County with a very safe and reliable transportation network.

SPLOST has made possible

- Over 800 miles of sidewalk will have been added alongside Cobb's roadways, providing pedestrians with safe access to schools, activity centers and transit.
- Over two-thirds of Cobb's major thoroughfares have been improved by safety and operational enhancements through a total investment of over \$1.2 B, allowing Cobb citizens better access to jobs, schools and universities, and major activity centers throughout the County.





Despite the investments made in preserving our existing infrastructure, the ongoing critical needs associated with resurfacing, bridges, etc. must be met to maintain the quality level of service that Cobb citizens expect.
