

SALUTING ACTS OF VALOR, YEARS OF SERVICE

Cobb County Police Department recently honored excellence throughout its department.

The March awards and recognition ceremony at the Jennie T. Anderson Theatre in Marietta saluted the service of almost a hundred officers, employees and select civilians.

"The men and women of the Cobb County Police Department work hard on a daily basis to serve the citizens," Police Chief John Houser said in a statement. "I am proud of all those officers who were recognized today for their outstanding service. Additionally, I want to thank each and every Cobb County police officer for their sacrifice, professionalism and dedication to our public safety efforts."

The "Blue Star" commendation, which honors an officer who was significantly physical injured while in the process of performing duties, was bestowed on Sgt. D.J. Mangold.

In May, Mangold helped subdue a violent subject who continued to attack even after he was shot and tasered multiple times by officers. Mangold remained in the fight, despite being thrown into a window and suffering an immobilizing shoulder injury.

Houser presented the Department Commendation Certificate, which awards a civilian resident who has given voluntary assistance and accomplished an act of outstanding personal performance for the department to Robert Moore and Robert Tenore.

Moore apprehended a bank robbery suspect after following him from the scene while Tenore helped save the life of a stabbing victim by applying first aid before officers arrived.

The Meritorious Service Award, which honors an officer who

has performed a meritorious deed for the department and the residents of Cobb, went to Ofc. Antonio O'Geen.

Houser honored Bill Borden with the "Chief's Award" for his efforts in support of the K9 unit, including arranging fundraisers.
