

Grants help fund road and transit upgrades

Cobb County recently earned a \$1.6 million grant award from the State Road and Tollway Authority to make improvements in the Six Flags area at Riverside Parkway. The grant will be provided through the Georgia Transportation Infrastructure Bank program. This project will improve mobility on Riverside Parkway from Interstate 20 eastbound to Six Flags Drive by realigning an intersection and improving sidewalks, traffic signals and signage. The project will also increase accessibility for thousands of employees and guests to Six Flags Over Georgia. Grant applications were ranked based on transportation/engineering merit, economic merit, local, state and federal matching funds and project specifics.

Cobb County also recently received more than \$8 million in grants through the state-funded GO! Transit Capital Program. The awards will fund bus route expansions. One grant totaling \$5,678,160 will fund the purchase of 12 new buses for the county's new route 10X. The route will reduce transfers and decrease travel time along the Interstate-75 corridor through limited stop express service from Town Center to the Midtown MARTA station. Six new buses for the Cumberland Circulator will be purchased with the second \$2,680,426 grant, which will allow for two new routes within the Cumberland Community Improvement District. The routes will improve access to locations such as SunTrust Park and the Cobb Galleria.

Seven Springs Water Park offers family fun

Seven Springs has two sessions this year and each session requires separate admission.
