

### HONORING THOSE WHO HELP THE COMMUNITY

Marietta firefighter was named Public Safety Employee of the Year during a Cobb Chamber of Commerce event on Monday, Oct. 2.

The annual event honors public safety employees from throughout the county and kicked off a week-long celebration of those workers and their efforts on behalf of the community. Public Safety Appreciation Week runs Oct. 2-8.

The employee of the year, Lt. Herman Trautwein, was on vacation in Daytona Beach last year when he spotted two people who had been struck by lightning while in shallow water. Without regard to his safety, he ran to help pull the man and woman from the water and began CPR on the victims.

Trautwein was able to save one of the patients.

Cobb County Firefighter Mark Blesener and Marietta Police Officer Scott Davis were awarded Medals of Valor during the Monday ceremony. Blesener helped rescue a hypothermic woman on the Chattanooga River after being lowered from a helicopter. Davis

was twice wounded in a gunfight, but still managed to relay a description of a vehicle that fled the scene of the shooting.

Cobb Fire and Emergency Services Capt. Josh Taylor and Cobb Police Det. Steve Hammond received the Award of Merit for their creation of the police Tactical First Aid program. This helps Cobb

officers provide immediate care to injured victims and increases their chance for survival. The Marietta Police Morning Watch, consisting of Officers Michael Malcolm and Kenyon Jackson, also earned the Award of Merit for their actions during the same August 2016 gunfight that Davis was wounded in.

Acworth Police Lt. Curtis Endicott and Smyrna Police Master Patrol Officer Louis Defense both received the Distinguished Achievement Award, recognizes an individual whose service and performance has exceeded the demands of the job.

Defense, a 16-year-veteran on the force, teaches the Smyrna Citizen's Police Academy and founded the cit's "Call Before You Go" program that helps escort business owners making financial deposits.

Endicott, who has spent 30 years in public safety, is known for new ideas, such as Acworth's Quality of Life unit, which enhances safety in parks.

Nominations for the awards program were received from public safety agencies throughout Cobb County, including police, fire, sheriff's office, campus police and EMS.

## County property taxes due this month

More than 261,500 bills, representing \$729,711,039 in 2017 property taxes, have been mailed. There were 245,942 bills resulting in \$674,891,143 for real property and 15,582 bills resulting in \$54,819,896 for personal property.



The Tax Commissioner's Office bills

and collects property taxes for Cobb County Government, Cobb County Board of Education, Cumberland and Town Center Community Improvement Districts and the Cumberland and Six Flags Special Services Districts.

All six of Cobb's cities bill and collect their own property taxes. State of Georgia property taxes have now been eliminated. Payments received or U.S. postmarked after Monday, **Oct. 16** will incur a 5 percent late penalty, plus monthly interest on the unpaid balance. Payments can be made online at www.cobbtax.org, by automated IVR at 1-866-PAY-COBB or by mail to P.O. Box 100127, Marietta, GA 30061-7027.

In-person payments are accepted at the Property Tax office at 736 Whitlock Ave., Marietta, the East Cobb Government Service Center at 4400 Lower Roswell Road in Marietta and the South Cobb Government Service Center at 4700 Austell Road in Austell. Payment drop boxes are located both inside and outside the Whitlock Avenue location, as well as inside both Government Service Centers. Payments via check will also be accepted at any Motor Vehicle office.
