WORKING TO PROVIDE A POSITIVE ENVIRONMENT FOR THE YOUTH OF COBB COUNTY TO INTERACT WITH POLICE

Cobb PAL has been hard at work and at play these last few months to provide the children and youth of Cobb County the chance to participate in numerous events in sports, recreation, mentoring, community activities and camps. While continuing the well-established PAL programs, Cobb PAL continually strives to add new programs and opportunities for the children and youth of Cobb County. Our PAL volunteers make this goal a reality, as can be attested to by the participation of one of our track "stars", Delano (DJ) Rodgers, Jr.

DJ joined the PAL track team in 2017 when he was 5 years old. He finished his inaugural season as the County Championship runner-up in the 100m, 200m and Standing Long Jump. He returned in the 2018 season to capture the County Championship titles in the 400m, 800m and 4x400 relay. After advancing out of the District Championship, he went on to win the 2018 State Championship 800m title. He finished out 2018 with 2nd place finishes in both the 400m and 800m at the AAU Primary National Championship in Orlando, FL.

In 2019, at 8 years old, under the guidance and coaching of the PAL track staff, he has been having his most successful season to date. He captured the AAU Indoor National titles in both the 400m and 800m and took 5th place in the 200m. He went on to win the County and District Championship titles in the 400m and 800m, setting new records in each. At the 2019 State Championship, he once again won the 800m title, finished second in the 400m and was part of the State Championship 4x100 team. In June, he competed in the USAFT National Youth Outdoor Championship in Durham, NC, where he placed 4th overall in the 200m and won the National Championship titles in both the 400m and 800m and 2:34 in the 800m. He will finish out 2019 competing in the AAU National Primary Championship and AAU Junior Olympic Games in July.

When not in track season, DJ plays football and can always be found with his older brother, Ronald, and younger brother, Noah, who are also members of the Cobb PAL track team. DJ is an honor roll student at the International Academy of Smyrna. Congratulations, DJ -- way to go!! (You can follow the success and journey on Instagram@Rodgers_boys3)



This quarter's Spotlight is on Officer Sydney Melton.


