Press Release Information on Sewer Overflow

Cobb County, GA - Aug 6, 2019

Pursuant to the rules and Regulations for Water Quality Control, Chapter 391-3-6-05, the Georgia Environmental Protection division now requires all publicly owned wastewater treatment works that discharge to the waters of the State to provide information on sewer overflows to local media contacts as part of ongoing, comprehensive public education and awareness efforts.

A wastewater overflow occurred on: August 5, 2019

Location of overflow: 1013 CROOKED CREEK CT, MABLETON, GA 30126

This overflow resulted from: GRAVEL

Resulting in a wastewater discharge into: Tributary to Nickajack Creek

The volume of the overflow was

estimated at:

80 Gallons

The Water System was notified at: Aug 5, 2019, 4:20 PM
The overflow was stopped at: Aug 5, 2019, 5:00 PM

Corrective action taken to reduce effects of the overflow include the following:

Unstopped blockage from mainline using jet machine. Cleaned and spread lime around spill area.

Field Observation:

Upon arrival, found manhole 214-H092 discharging sewage with lid in place. Sewage left spill area of approx. 2'x8', leading to nearby creek. Creek looked gray from sewage.
