The rates provided in the Schedule of Equipment Rates are for equipment in good mechanical condition, complete with all required attachments. Each rate covers all costs eligible under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, 42 U.S.C. § 5121, et seq., for ownership and operation of equipment, including depreciation, overhead, all maintenance, field repairs, fuel, lubricants, tires, OSHA equipment and other costs incidental to operation. Standby equipment costs are not eligible. Equipment must be in actual operation performing eligible work in order the reimbursement to be eligible. LABOR COST OF OPERATOR ARE NOT INCLUDED in the established FEMA Schedule of Equipment Rates found on the website. Unit Price Contract Bidders should add the applicable labor cost of operator to the established FEMA equipment rates for the price bid for each line item in Section 900.

Hourly Equipment

Hourly equipment shall consist of the described equipment complete with an experienced and competent operator. The equipment in good operating condition and shall be fueled and completely maintained at no additional cost.

Measurement and Payment

- A. Hourly equipment will be measured and paid by the actual hours worked.
- B. Hourly equipment will not be measured for payment when the equipment is idle and/or not working due to mechanical problems.
- C. Hourly equipment shall be provided as directed by the Engineer.

- D. No separate measurement or payment will be made for the equipment operator, equipment mechanic, or any maintenance labor. Such cost shall be considered incidental to the hourly cost of the equipment.
