waterSmart™ Honors 12 Cobb County Middle School Students in waterSmart waterArt Calendar Contest

Cobb County middle school students were invited to use their talent to create a 2-D work of art for the 11th annual waterSmart waterArt calendar contest.

This contest is a collaborative program of the Cobb County Water System (CCWS) and Cobb County-Marietta Water Authority (CCMWA) that encourages students to creatively answer the question “How is Water Important to Me?” The waterSmart program was initiated by the CCMWA in 2000, to educate its service area residents of all ages about the importance of indoor and outdoor water conservation, and to help encourage sustainable, year-round conservation, regardless of climate conditions.

Students from seven Cobb County middle schools submitted artwork, which was judged on creativity, relevance, and artistic ability. The 12 winning entries will be featured in the 2021 waterSmart waterArt calendar that will be distributed throughout Cobb County.
