Cobb Opioid Project Case Management

July of 2018, Cobb County ranked number 1 in 5 counties as having the highest opioid use; according to Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI) crime lab. While opioid addiction and misuse continue to rise, there has been a significant correlation between individuals who suffer from substance use disorder and criminal justice involvement. The Cobb District Attorney's Office trust, in order to fight against the recent opioid epidemic wave, engaged case management services can better equip opioid offenders with skills and resources that will reduce the likelihood of re-offending or re-using. Case management services is aimed to decrease the cycle of re-arrest for opioid offenders by addressing unrelated mental illness, poverty and homelessness centered around opioid addictive behaviors. While providing support and assistance delivered through a holistic approach roadmap to address multifaceted needs of offenders and their families or support systems.

Target Population

- Offenders accepted into Pre-Trial Diversion Program, with first non-violent offense.
- Offenders with an opioid related offense (s) and/or offenders with known opioid related concerns/history.
- Individuals who are under Cobb Department of Community Supervisions or receiving local services with Division of Family and Children Services (DFACS).
