

Dare to Dream - Supplies List

Substrate of your choice-wood, canvas panel, or PRIMED (with gesso)
heavyweight paper or card are all suitable .

(I used a small 7" x 5" canvas on this occasion.)

A couple of brushes-NOT expensive ones! An old scrubby one and a small round for finer marks is enough. (I used a scruffy old flat brush and a small round for a few details)

Water,cloth,mixing plate or palette.

Selection of collage papers,ephemera and tissue.

Choose colours that work together. Dressmakers pattern tissue is VERY useful if you have it.

Butterfly wings image to cut out-can be printed,painted,stamped etc

Scissors

A scrap of card-top of a cereal box ideal!

Tinfoil (Aluminium foil)

Two/three or four acrylic paints in toning colours to your collage pieces.

My colour scheme was vintage pinks and green, so I used :

Winsor Newton Galeria Buff Titanium

Winsor Newton Galeria Burgundy

Sennelier Abstract Earth Green

Sennelier Abstract Raw Sienna

Plus Acrylic paints in Black and White - your preferred brand.

Acrylic Matt Medium - your preferred brand. You can substitute other glues such as PVA (this will have a gloss seal when dried) or Mod Podge according to your supplies.

A least one of your favourite pattern making tools, in the form of foam or rubber stamp, sponges or stencil. I used an old foam stamp with scroll patterning and a scrap of natural sponge to apply layers.

Obviously you may wish to change or personalise the quote- the 'Dare To Dream' wording isn't compulsory!

Also, nice, but not necessary to complete this project : a few similar colours in water-based media.

I used : Derwent watercolour pencils in May Green (48), Cedar Green (50).

optional a metallic acrylic paint (I used Sennelier Abstract Irridescent Bronze)

optional small alphabet stamps (you can also write or print your quote)

optional a small (jeweller's) hammer - alternatively this can be done by hand or an improvised tool that you can hammer lightly with can be used!

optional varnish or gel medium to seal the finished piece if desired (I used Liquitex Fluid Gloss Medium.)
