

Practical Agro-Homeopathy for Growers and Gardeners

Agro-Homeopathy, also referred to as DHDs (Dynamised High Dilutions), is a fast-growing field in horticulture which has the capacity to address many of the challenges faced by growers and gardeners today including the urgent need to move away from unsustainable, high-input systems.

THERAPEUTIC REMEDY GUIDE

Aconite, no 1 for shock. Rust light coloured, frostbite, exposure to cold conditions, sudden weather change, transplant shock, Barley yellow dwarf virus.	Kali phos, (Potassium phosphate) after potassium or phosphorus excess.
Allium Cepa, (onion) companion to carrot, carrot fly, Roses, Apple trees.	Kali carb, (Potassium Carbonate) chlorosis, paleness starts at base of leaves, veins go pale first.
Arnica, no 1 for any injurious intervention including transplantation, damage from wind, pruning, and clipping.	Lycopodium, (Club moss) aluminium toxicity.
Bacillus Thuringiensis, Caterpillars, worms, larvae.	Nux Vomica, toxicity, exposure to synthetic chemicals, poisoning
Belladonna, Rust, when dark red, black spot. Any dark red discolouration. Very thirsty plant. Heat stress. Lack of water.	Phaseolus, (bean), companion to potato
Borax (Natrium biboraticum) Boron toxicity or imbalances.	Ricinus communis, (castor oil plant), companion to all vines, courgette, cucumber etc
Calcarea Carbonate (Calc Carb), Calcium imbalance, late developers, over-fed plants	Salicylic acid, mosaic virus.
Calendula, (Marigold) nematodes, transplant shock, cutting and clipping, Ants. Universal companion.	Sambucus nigra, (Box elder), caterpillars
Carbo Veg Loss of fluids - lack of water. Insufficient oxygen. Tomato Blight. Ailing plants on their way out.	Secale cornutum, (ergot), Ergot in all grains and grasses.
Coccinella, (Ladybird), aphids, sawfly, whitefly, blackfly and all soft-bodied insects	Silicea, (the key to homoeopathic horticulture), greening deserts, water retention, seed sprouting, when plants don't thrive, most fungal diseases.
Ferrum (metallicum, phosphoricum, sulphuricum) chlorosis, paleness starts at edge of leaves, veins stay green	Solanum tuberosum agrotans, potato blight.
Helix Tosta: Slugs and Snails. Plants become resistant after remedy application.	Syrphnilida (Hoverfly) Predator of Aphids and many other soft-bodied flies.
Juglans nigra, (Black walnut), suppression of weeds	Thuja, No 1 for fungal infections and warty growths.(Conifer), borers of any kind, gall wasp, leaf miner.

APPLICATION GUIDE

Do be prepared to experiment with potency, dosage ratios and frequency of application. This is an emergent methodology and people are experimenting both in terms of science and practical application. Farmers tend to develop their own ratios for remedies and a range of potencies have been used in trials and scientific experiments.

Potency:

The main potencies commonly available in homeopathic remedy kits are 30c and 200c. In trials, 12c has also been widely used.

Dosage:

For immediate usage:

Pillules or medicating potency (MP)

10 pillules/MP of the remedy/DHD per 50L of water

25 pillules/MP of the remedy/DHD per 1000 L of water

To make a 'stock' or 'mother' liquid remedy: add a few drops of medicating potency or a few pillules into 100ml of water and add 10ml of vodka or apple cider vinegar as a preservative. KEEP BOTTLE OUT OF DIRECT SUNLIGHT!

Usage:

20 ml of the remedy/DHD per hectare

10 ml of the remedy/DHD per hectare

10 ml of the remedy/DHD per 1000 L of water

5 ml of the remedy/DHD per 1000 L of water

5 ml of the remedy/DHD per 200 L of water

1 ml of the remedy/DHD per 50 L of water

1 ml of the remedy/DHD per 100ml or 50 ml of water

Very often one application brings results.
