Foreword

This eBook is only useful if you use it correctly. Here are some tips for making the most of this eBook, good luck!

Print and Pin

One technique that has helped former students was to print the different pages and pin them in different places around their homes. This was useful because students were able to walk into the kitchen and take a quick glance at the papers and retain more information. They could take a moment to have a deeper glance at the paper and even make sample sentences using their imagination. Try it. It might work for you. Whenever you walk into a room, look at the paper and make a full sentence.

Balance

Balance is key when preparing for the CELPIP speaking exam. While this eBook has everything you need to secure a solid structure and use the right words, you need to also not fully rely on it all the time. This means that as you practice more and more, try use the eBook less and less. Like using a crutch after surgery, it helps at the start, but you have to let it go eventually.

Ideas are on you

This eBook will 100% help you with CELPIP speaking structure, knowledge, and vocabulary. However, it will not help with your imagination and getting ideas. That is on you. However, there are ways to help yourself get ideas for CELPIP. Let's talk about *Task 1: Giving Advice*. For this question, you should be able to think of two or three pieces of *real* and *practical* advice. You can draw on your own life experiences, you can use memories, you can use your 100% imagination. You can lie. Remember this is an English test, not an honesty test.

However, *Task 7: Express Your Opinion* is a lot more difficult than *Task 1: Giving Advice*. You might be asked questions about a topic you have no interest in, and you are going to HAVE TO answer it. You know what that means? You're probably going to have to lie and have a well-structured answer. Regardless of the topic in *Task 7: Express Your Opinion*, you can always say things like: *I'm not where I was going with that* or *Well this is a very difficult question*. These can help you buy time to think of ideas on the fly. Also, practice using the phrases in this eBook so you will 100% have a structured answer in CELPIP.

The last word for ideas, fucking practice! The more you practice, the more ideas you will generate. The more ideas you generate between now and your exam, the easier the exam is.

Structure is Sexy

There is nothing worse than when a person is giving a CELPIP answer and they are not structured. They start off by talking about X, then they talk about A, then they go back to talking about X before they suddenly introduce G, and by the time they have finished speaking, they have not made a single point. Please have structure in your CELPIP speaking exam. This eBook will 100% help you with structure.

No Surprises

There should be no surprises in your CELPIP speaking exam. What do I mean by this? By the time you go into the CELPIP Speaking exam, you should know exactly what type of questions are coming up, how long you have to prepare for each question, and how long you must speak for in each question.

This should be no fucking surprise. Did you read that? THIS SHOULD BE NO FUCKING SURPRISE.

You should know what structure you are going to use for each question BEFORE you go into the CELPIP speaking exam. It's simple, the less surprises in the CELPIP speaking exam, the higher your score will be.

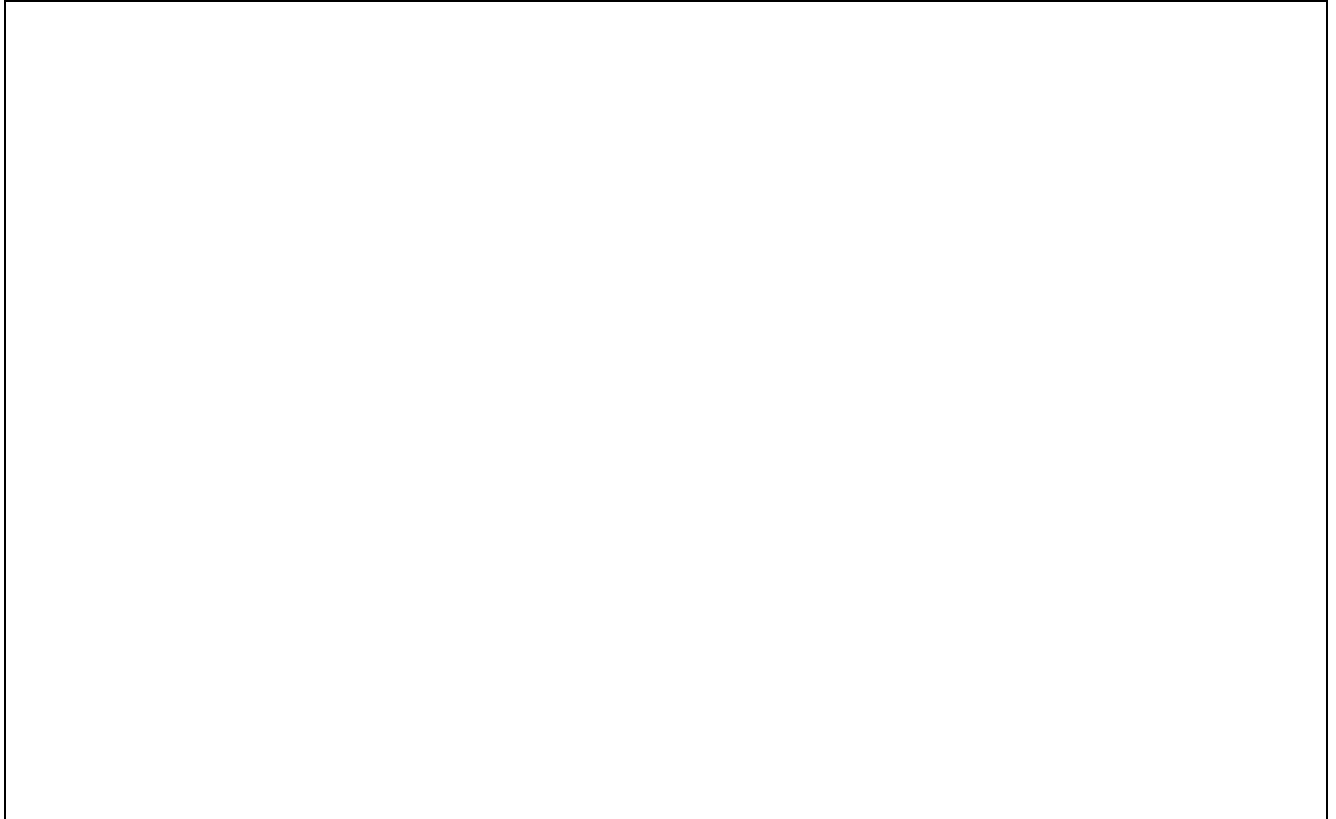

CELPIP Speaking Checklist

The CELPIP Speaking Checklist

The CELPIP Speaking Checklist is one of the best ways to ensure you stay on track, focused, and secure the highest possible CELPIP score you can.

Here's how it works:

First, plan, prepare, and deliver your CELPIP speaking answer.

After that, listen to your answer. As you listen, have the CELPIP Speaking Checklist open beside you. Listen carefully and be honest with your self-assessment. For example, if your self-assessment looks like this:

You know EXACTLY what you need to focus on. Once you have a self-assessment that looks like this:

You know you are on the right track for a 9+ in CELPIP Speaking!

How often should I use this?

My recommendation is simple, as often as possible without burnout! What I mean by this is at least once a week, sit down and do a full CELPIP speaking exam without a break. This is important because you need to get used to the duration of the exam as well as the endurance needed to complete the exam. For example, maybe every Thursday for one month you are going to sit down and do a full CELPIP Speaking exam. Do the exam, take a break, and then compare your answer to the CELPIP Speaking Checklist I have given you.

CELPID Speaking Checklist

The Last Word

Similar to the CELPIP Key English eBook, print it and pin it! Get familiar with this document and what each CELPIP questions requires. For instance, in Task 2: A Personal Experience you need to use *several* past tense forms. Not just the past simple, you should also use the past perfect and the past continuous. You should know this BEFORE you walk into the CELPIP speaking exam. In Task 5: Compare and Persuade, you need to be considerate but firm. This means you need to be strong and polite at the same time. You should know this BEFORE you walk into the CELPIP exam.

This checklist will 100% keep you focused, keep you on track, and keep you improving your CELPIP Speaking score everything you revise it, study it, or use it.
