Textbook: You should have access to Campbell Biology (any edition, but I will go off of the 11th edition refereeing to chapters). If reading helps you, feel free to read ahead.

In Class work: We will be doing in class work that will be graded for thoughtful effort. We may have peer accountability sheets if equal participation is an issue. If you have issues working in groups or with particular members of the class that you cannot resolve yourself, please talk to me. By entering into the class you have agreed to abide by UCSD's Principles of Community: https://ucsd.edu/about/principles.html; which includes treating all individuals with respect.

Attendance. I expect you to attend lectures and discussion sections. In class assignments and participation points will be given in both, so if you are absent you will miss these points.

Absences: If you miss class, you will miss points associated with the activities that we do in class. I will only excuse or modify an assignment if you are absent because of something that is **unforeseeable** and **out of your control**. Work and other classes are not unforeseeable, even if schedules are out of your control. Illness, serious injury, family emergencies are considered unforeseeable and out of your control. But, you need to let me know ASAP to make up activities. Summer quarter moves very quickly! Please talk to me on an individual basis if you have any questions or concerns.

Clickers: We will be using clickers in lecture. You can use any version of the clicker, purchase a used clicker, or borrow a clicker form a friend (who is not enrolled in this class). If you purchase a clicker, you can sell it after this class is over. If you do not have a clicker on the first day you can submit answers via paper ON THE FIRST DAY ONLY. We will not accept paper clicker answers after the first day. It is your responsibility to make sure that your clicker is registered (on CANVAS) and that it is functioning during class. If you bring another students clicker to class and answer for them, this is considered academic dishonesty and you will be dealt with accordingly (see Academic Integrity section). You only need to get 80% of the clicker points to get the full 50 points for the semester. So, if you forget your clicker one day, are in the restroom while a question happens, etc, don't worry, as long as this doesn't happen frequently. You cannot get above 100% for the clicker points.

Midterm and Final: If you miss a <u>midterm</u> for an **excused** absence (see absences), then your final, quiz and other midterm will count towards your course grade in place of the missed midterm. You may also have a few extra questions on the final to make up for content not represented on the final exam. You cannot miss the final. There is no time to make up the final in summer quarter, so you cannot miss it. The final will be partially cumulative, be weighted towards things covered in the later parts of the quarter. If you have an extenuating circumstance that causes you to suddenly miss the final (i.e. your appendix bursts) you will be given an essay exam to make up the final, and likely an incomplete until this exam is made up. Paper documentation needs to be provided as soon as possible to make up exams for excused absences.

You will only be able to review your exams during the designated discussion time. If you cannot make that time, then you need to email Dr. Butler AHEAD OF TIME (i.e. before exams are handed back in discussion) to schedule another time to look at your exam. You will not be able to look at your midterms later in the quarter.

Grading

You can receive up to 500 points in this class. The number of points that you receive will be divided by the maximum number of points possible to calculate your grade as a percentage. If we do not get to all of the activities, the denominator will be adjusted.
