This course explores key thinkers in the development of 20th century Islamic political thought. We will consider how thinkers from Morocco to South Asia have used religious arguments to inform their political philosophies. The course will begin with the demise of the Ottoman Empire which prompted an exciting wave of theoretical ferment across the Islamic world. We start off with Islamic modernism and then examine the rise and development of Islamism in a variety of forms. We conclude with a return to liberal developments both from within and outside the Islamist tradition.
