Play Garden

We play so children can interact, have fun, and form friendships. Remember, in this program about self-esteem, fun and laughter are paramount. We want children to return home happy every day, remembering how valuable they are.

LESSON 1

Catch insects in the garden

You will need to place ladybugs on two poles, butterflies on two poles, and a flower on the centre pole. You will also need bottle rings for the children to use.

The children will be divided into two teams, and the team with the most points will win. Ladybugs are worth two points, butterflies are worth one point, and if a ring lands on the flower, one point will be deducted. You will need someone to keep track of the score, or you may use a whiteboard.



LESSON 2

Catch insects with a basket

You will need a basket or catching container for each child, along with several inflated balls or balloons (ball-sized) in two different colours. Divide the children into two teams. Two teachers will throw the balls, and the children will try to catch them in their baskets. The children should be spread out so that members of the same team are not all in one section. The team that collects the most balls wins



LESSON 3

Volleyball Screen

You will need 2 large fabrics and 2 plastic balls

Form two teams.
Each team must hold their cloth by the edges and throw the ball from one cloth to the other.



LESSON 4

Balloon Target Shooting

3 toy darts are required.

A row of red balloons with black dots representing ladybugs will be placed in the center.

The rest of the balloons can be colored.

All children will be entitled to 3 shots without popping the red balloons.

The winner is the one who bursts 3 with their 3 shots without bursting the red ones.



LESSON 5

Feeding Garden Bugs

A target is needed for balls decorated with insects, with the holes being their mouths.

The children will try to put the balls in the insects' mouths, pretending to feed them.
