SOUTH PIERCE FIRE AND RESCUE

- I have commenced 24hr shifts, working as IC2 position on large events.
- SPFR continues to bargain the reorganization of the command staff with L-726.
- SPFR continues with 5 cadets in the Browns Point Fire Academy. Graduation for the academy is scheduled for June 28th in Brown's Point.
- In talks with PCFD Zone 6 group to partner to upgrade responses for local Wildland emergencies. This would include upstaffing an additional brush truck for Red Flag warning events.
- SPFR will be participating in Pub Ed events as the COVID rules relax. We will be participating on the Eatonville 4th of July Parade, Roy Elementary Field Days, and I will be judging the Roy Elementary PTA Online Pet Show. SPFR will start CPR/First Aid classes as soon as allowed.
- SPFR Support Services will be assisting Eatonville PD with upcoming events.

General

Assistant to the Chief Glen Yates, Officer McGuire and I we were able to install the new wood/laminate flooring inside the EPD station. It is a very welcomed improvement.

A big thank you to Council member Dunn for assisting me with an episode of "Cop Joke Friday".

Public Safety Committee

Discussions included the draft of the video surveillance policy, RMSA grants, and traffic revision on Adams Avenue.

Management Activities

Officer McGuire returned from light duty. Abby Gribi expressed her appreciation for the work Officer McGuire was able to complete on the cemetery project while he was on light duty.

Planning continues for the 2021 National Night Out on August 3rd. EPD Officers are formulating their plans for their displays/activities and we have commitments from several participants already. Planning for the July 3rd/4th festivities are also underway.

We are still moving forward with the mobile fingerprint identification beta program. The vendor is working with our and Pierce County's I.T. departments to ensure compatibility and security of the systems. Part of this compatibility includes dual-authentication software which is a prerequisite to installing fingerprint identification software.

I attended several briefings from the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC) regarding the recently signed legislative bills as they apply law enforcement and operations. I briefed my Officers on these updates and how they will affect our daily operations and our department. I will also brief these during the Public Safety Committee meeting in June.

I have begun research body cameras for EPD Officers due to new mandates drawn out in the recent WA State legislation. We have located a vendor and completed reference checks.
