JUNE 2021 REPORT

General

The 3rd and 4th of July celebrations were a success with only minor incidents to tend to. A full brief will be provided in July's department report.

Public Safety Committee

Discussions on June 1st included a summary of WA legislation adoptions and continued discussion of reconfiguring Adams Avenue.

Management Activities

We have received a contract from Provision regarding the implementation of body cameras for all EPD officers. This will be presented to council in July.

I continued attending briefings from the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC) regarding the recently signed legislative bills as they apply law enforcement and operations. I briefed my Officers on these updates and how they will affect our daily operations and our department.

I developed an informational booklet for the council and the citizens of our community detailing the adopted legislative changes that effect EPD's policies, procedures and how that will change the way we provide service to our community. I plan to make this available to the council and the public both on Facebook and in hard-copy form.

Planning continues for the 2021 National Night Out on August 3rd. EPD Officers are formulating their plans for their displays/activities and we have commitments from several participants already.

SOUTH PIERCE FIRE AND RESCUE

- Fire Chief's 24hr shifts and continuing. I worked a 48hr shift over the holiday weekend with no major emergency events.
- SPFR is currently running at minimum staffing due to long term disabilities and vacations. We have a large number of mandatory shifts being filled and supplementing with volunteer staff
- SPFR continues to bargain the reorganization and testing processes of the command staff with L-726.
- SPFR has graduated with 5 firefighters from the Browns Point Volunteer Fire Academy. 4 of 5 are currently attending an EMT academy at Bates Technical College.
- SPFR currently has 6 and possibly 8 additional firefighter candidates going through the recruitment process for the next volunteer academy. We plan on running our own academy later this year with dates TBD.
- SPFR participated in both the Eatonville and Roy's 3rd & 4th of July festivals which included fireworks displays. in Pub Ed events as the COVID rules relax. SPFR will start CPR/First Aid classes as soon as allowed.
