## **SOUTH PIERCE FIRE AND RESCUE**

---

- Fire Chief continues to work 24hr shifts.
- SPFR is currently running at minimum staffing due to long term disabilities and vacations. We have many mandatory shifts being filled and supplementing with volunteer staff
- SPFR continues to bargain the reorganization and testing processes of the command staff with L-726.
- SPFR has graduated two new probationary firefighters from the Bates Technical College Fire Academy Class 21B-90, the 'Thundercat's'.
- SPFR will be running our own Volunteer Academy starting on September 6<sup>th</sup>, 2021. We estimate 8 to 10 recruits.
- SPFR participated with the Eatonville Police and CERT during the National Night Out on the 2<sup>nd</sup>. We will also be participating and providing a First Aid tent at the Somethingmore Family Festival on August 7<sup>th</sup>. SPFR has also started advertising and will start CPR/First Aid classes as soon as allowed.

- Inspect new Water / Sewer connections.

### **General**

The 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> of July celebrations were a success with only minor incidents to tend to. There were no arrests and only a handful of minor incidents that were handled verbally (i.e. unauthorized dogs, parking violations, firework violations).

### **Public Safety Committee**

Discussions on July 6<sup>th</sup> included a continued discussion and summary of WA legislation adoptions, the body camera contract was approved to move forward to council, continued discussion of reconfiguring Adams Avenue, and ARPA funds and the purchase of the fingerprint scanner.

### **Management Activities**

I was on annual and out of state July 18<sup>th</sup> through the 29<sup>th</sup>. Officer McGuire was stepped up in my absence.

I continued attending briefings from the Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC) regarding the recently signed legislative bills as they apply law enforcement and operations. I briefed my Officers on these updates and how they will affect our daily operations and our department.

The informational booklet for the council and the citizens of our community detailing the adopted legislative changes that affect EPD's policies, procedures and how that will change the way we provide service to our community was printed and distributed. It was also made available in digital format on EPD's Facebook page. I have received positive feedback from the citizen regarding this material and the vast majority are sympathetic to the changes and the associated challenges.
