Management Activities


I was on annual and out of state training August 27th through September 3rd. Officer McGuire was stepped up in my absence.

SOUTH PIERCE FIRE AND RESCUE

- Fire Chief continues to work 24hr shifts.
- SPFR is currently running at minimum staffing most shifts due to long term disabilities and vacations. We have many mandatory shifts being filled and supplementing with volunteer staff
- SPFR has begun mediation meetings on the reorganization and testing processes with L-726.
- SPFR began our in house Volunteer Academy on September 7th, 2021. We currently have 6 recruits.
- SPFR participated in the Roy Rodeo on September 4th & 5th.
- SPFR will be participating in the 25th Annual Rod knockers Car Show by providing a First Aid & information station in front of the SPFR Administrative Building at 129 Mashell Ave. N. on September 18th.
- SPFR has started providing open CPR/First Aid classes starting on September 25th.
- SPFR members will also be participating in a Highway Clean-Up project on September 23rd.
- SPFR Members will be travel to the Spartan Manufacturing Plant in South Dakota to complete a final inspection of the new Fire Engine. The new engine is projected to be in service in November. The "Push in" ceremony date at Station #170 is TBD.

- Daily pick up garbage in parks

- Daily meter reads move in/outs.
- Locates as requested around town
- Fill pot holes around town.
- Mow grass in parks
- Train employees at both water and wastewater plants
- Clean sewer lift stations
- Various afterhours WTP and WWTP alarms
- Install several street signs around town
- Inspect new Water / Sewer connections.

1. EMC Chapter 14-District Regulations review

We reminded ourselves of how the previous discussions went for the title 19 review for the commercial sections of the design standards. We had more discussions about the commercial standards as a whole and decided what to keep and what to remove. Staff will be preparing a draft for us to review at our next meeting and afterwards we will continue into multi family design standards.

As a side note we are having two hearings on September 7 for a rezone on Washington Avenue and a hearing for Lynch Creek Subdivision. We plan to get back to the design standards after that. I request that our next regular meeting take place on September 21.
