Officer Wade was involved in a serious off-duty automobile accident and spent approximately two weeks in the hospital. He has recovered but is still on sick leave as he heals and waits for clearance from his doctor to return to duty.

There was no public safety committee meeting in September.

#### Management Activities


Officers McGuire, Anderson, and Duran have doing their best to cover Officer Wade's shifts on overtime while he is out on sick leave. However, the gap in coverage resulted in 15 calls that were covered by PCSD (about a 200% increase over the normal average).


On Sept. 8<sup>h</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> Officers Duran, Anderson and McGuire attended a regional training which included the contract cities of University Place, Edgewood and Pierce Transit. 24 students attended the Law Enforcement Casualty Care (LECC) taught by Blair Dell from BMK Ventures. The training day was extremely successful and prepared the students to care and treat victims of a mass casualty incident such as an active shooter or natural disaster. This training also supports new state legislative mandates for officers to be able to provide lifesaving care.

To supplement the aforementioned LECC training, I purchased 4 mass casualty response kits to issue to each of my officers. These kits will better equip our officers to be able to respond and appropriately treat victims of a mass casualty event. The kits will be completed and delivered mid-October.

#### **SOUTH PIERCE FIRE AND RESCUE**

- SPFR continues with mediation meetings on the reorganization and testing processes with L-726.
- SPFR began our in-house Volunteer Academy on September 7<sup>th</sup>, 2021. We currently have 6 recruits.
- SPFR participated in the Roy Rodeo on September 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup>.
- SPFR participated in the 25<sup>th</sup> Annual Rod knockers Car Show by providing a First Aid & information station in front of the SPFR Administrative Building.
- SPFR has started providing open CPR/First Aid classes.
- SPFR members participated in the "Adopt A Highway" clean-Up project on September 23<sup>rd</sup>.
- SPFR Members completed the final inspection of the new fire engine from Spartan Manufacturing. The new engine is projected to be in service in November. The "Push in" ceremony date at Station #170 is TBD.

## General

The meeting went efficiently. We got through our agenda items.

# **Current Tasks**

## 1. EMC Chapter 19- Commercial and Multifamily

We did not have our meeting on September 20 because of the planned but short notice power outage and to give Scott Clark more time to prepare the edits we requested for Title 19's Commercial and Multifamily section. We went over those this evening, are happy with the edits we made and are ready for a final review of the rest of Title 19 before we send it to you for your approval. The requested agenda for this meeting only included the commercial portion so we would like to have the entire Title 19 on our agenda for our next meeting to go over it one last time. In short we believe that less can lead to more and you will see what I mean when we send the full Chapter to you for review along with a letter accompanying the Title 19 in my next report to the council.

On another note, since we are wrapping up Title 19 soon we would like to start discussions, if possible, about short term rental regulations.

With the rise in "Air BnB" type short term rental housing across the region, especially near the park service at Mt. Rainier, the current hardship in finding somewhere to live in the area and town is very real. The superintendent for Mt. Rainier even mentioned two years ago at a meeting in Elk Plain that he had many seasonal positions go unfilled for the 2019 summer because there was nowhere for those employees to live due the the

meteoric rise in Air Bnb rentals. This goes for every industry in the area, especially the service/retail industries. This issue is very well documented across the nation as well and has been allowed to go on without regulation of some kind. Many other municipalities across the nation are adopting regulations regarding short term rentals in order to encourage longer term housing to preserve communities and their neighborhoods. With no references in Eatonville's code regarding short term rental housing, we believe it prudent to bring this to the planning commission for consideration, discussions and to bring something to recommend to you. This way the town can have something in place before it turns into something unmanageable down the road. As we are a body of non-elected officials who, along with the planners, advise the town on regulation/code reviews, we believe this is within our purview and jurisdiction to investigate this for the benefit of the citizenry.

In short our next requested agenda is as follows:
