SOUTH PIERCE FIRE AND RESCUE

- SPFR continues mediation meetings on the reorganization and testing processes with L-726
- SPFR has completed an in-house Volunteer Academy. Recruits have completed the testing process for their FF1 & HazMat Operations. They will attend the next available Emergency medical Technician (EMT) class
- SPFR has hired three full time/career positions. Firefighters Butler, Whitley, & Frick started on January 1st, 2022. This marks the first time SPFR has been fully staffed.
- SPFR has taken delivery of a new Spartan Fire Engine. We are currently completing inservice training and with a "Push in" ceremony date at Station #170 is TBD
- The Fire Chief and Board of Commissioners would like to schedule a meeting with the new mayor to discuss direction of the fire department and begin contract negotiations

General

I am looking forward to a productive and safe new year. I would like to welcome our new Mayor, David Baublits, and new council members, Peter Paul and Kyle Litzenberger.

Public Safety Committee

There was no public safety committee meeting in December.

Management Activities

EPD's newest Assistant to the Chief, Kendra Morrison, continues to excel in her position and is quickly getting up to speed with procedures and policies, while attaining her required certifications and qualifications to successfully serve in her position.

Eatonville continues to experience a consistent but leveled out number of incidents of commercial and private theft/burglary cases which are consistent with the surrounding unincorporated Pierce County areas. We are targeting specific areas of vulnerability and our officers are aware of, and have reacted to, the need for increased proactiveness.

I have several goals for EPD in 2022 which include but are not limited to a town employee training day on response to an active shooter, explore a contact for services with the Nisqually Jail, obtain updated officers' Tasers and replacement automated external defibrillators (AEDs), and conduct community outreach with various groups of diversity within the Town of Eatonville.

I received my body camera and vehicle front dash view/prisoner compartment view cameras from the Pierce County Sheriff's Department. They are currently in deployment.

In December 2021- EPD had 171 total calls for service.

42 Fire service calls




