SOUTH PIERCE FIRE AND RESCUE

- SPFR continues negotiations with Local-726 to reorganize district command structure and promotional testing process
- SPFR continues the process to find a new Chief Financial Officer and Board Secretary.
- SPFR has three new career members in the West Pierce Fire & Rescue "Red Knights" recruit academy.
- Voluntary firefighter academy continues in conjunction with Browns Point with four additional recruits. We will be running another in-house academy later this year
- SPFR has replaced E06-1 with E05-1 as the new 1st out engine for Station 84 in the Town of Eatonville. A new set of extrication equipment to update and upgrade the capabilities at Station 84 has been ordered for the Town of Eatonville.
- The Fire Chief and Board of Commissioners attended a working group meeting in February and hope to continue the discussion about contract options and assist with EMS Levy renewal process.

FEBRUARY_2022 REPORT

General

We will soon begin the search for a candidate to replace Officer Duran. Officer Duran is planning on remaining on staff until we can find his replacement.

Public Safety Committee

There was no public safety commission meeting in February.

Management Activities

EPD took delivery of our patrol vehicle for the new police chief. I located the 2021 Dodge Durango at an approved government contract dealer. The vehicle was a "demo" with 400 miles on the odometer which allowed us to take advantage of a \$3750.00 discount. The vehicle was also partially outfitted as a demo which provided a savings over aftermarket outfitting (i.e. cage divider, window barriers, hard passenger compartment seats, push and PIT bars, locking equipment tray, and polymer prisoner seat).

I have begun to procure essential equipment needed for the new police Chief.

We (officers and I) began collaboration on drafting up new design for our patrol car graphics. The new design will be implemented on the new chief's patrol car and will be phased in on the remaining patrol vehicles over the next year or two. The new graphic will most likely feature the EPD patch. I have asked several Town employees for their input as well.

I continue to attend weekly updates from Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC) regarding legislative updates on bills pertaining to police reform.

In **February** 2021- EPD had 130 total calls for service.




