#### Public Safety Committee

There was not a public safety committee meeting in April.

#### *Management Activities*

The negotiations to purchase my former patrol car from PCSD is ongoing and is "on the desk" of Pierce County Finance. I should receive a quote soon which I can present to the mayor/council for approval.

I have started a grant application through the Department of Justice to obtain funding for officer body armor. The deadline is mid-June 2022 and should receive confirmation before the years end.

My patrol car is scheduled to be outfitted on May 9<sup>th</sup> and should be completed and ready for use and in service by May 13<sup>th</sup>.

April 27<sup>th</sup> Chief Wernet and I conducted our second "Coffee with the Chief's" at Bruno's restaurant. It was a success, and we plan to facilitate these about once a month.

We have not received any applicants for the lateral police officer position. I may need to propose a hiring incentive to increase competitiveness, juxtaposing the cost benefits/time complications over a new hire/entry level.

- SPFR continues negotiations with Local-726 to reorganize district command structure and promotional testing process.
- SPFR continues with its Citizens Committee to on the EMS Levy Lift/Renewal.
- SPFR has hired a new Chief Financial Officer/Board Secretary. We would like to welcome Rebecca Nason to our team.
- SPFR's three career members in the West Pierce Fire & Rescue will be graduating on May 19<sup>th</sup>.
- Voluntary firefighter academy continues in conjunction with Browns Point. We currently have two recruits moving forward. We will be running another in-house academy later this year. We also have three volunteer firefighters starting the EMT academy soon.
- SPFR has started teaching CPR classes again at the Administrative Offices.
