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### General

#### Public Safety Committee

#### *Management Activities*

The negotiations to purchase my former patrol car from PCSD has ended as I declined the proposed offer of a sale price. I located an available pool vehicle at another agency and will be submitting a request for purchase.

On August 4<sup>th</sup> I attended a regional law enforcement breakfast meeting involving surrounding agencies such as the Pierce County Sheriff's Department (PCSD), Yelm PD, Joint Base Lewis McChord Police, and the Thurston County Sheriff's Department. This will be a reoccurring monthly meeting and is an excellent networking opportunity to discuss legal updates, trans-jurisdictional case information, training, and current trends.

On August 24<sup>th</sup> I conducted a National Night Out event debrief. Overall, we were very pleased with this year's event, and we walked away from the meeting with great ideas to improve next year's celebration. Later that day we hosted "Lunch with the Chief" at Glacier View Park. This lunch was for the 7 youth who were awarded from the "Plinco" game at National Night Out that Kendra Morrison designed and implemented.

We conducted an oral hiring board for our lateral candidate on August 30<sup>th</sup>. He was successful and passed the board process. I received very positive feedback from the interviewing team that consisted of Officer Jason McGuire, PCSD Lieutenant Byron Brockway and PCSD Sergeant Erk Clark. The candidate will be moving forward with an interview with me, polygraph exam, psychological exam, and medical evaluation.

We received the in-car computer dock stations which were purchased with ARPA funds. Our I.T. department (Blacksheep) is in the process of merging over to the new/updated laptops computers we obtained from PCSD surplus.

I attended a public information officer training in Clearwater, FL August 27<sup>th</sup> through September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022. This was hosted by the National Information Officer's Association. The conference was extremely beneficial to my dual role as the multimedia manager and spokesperson for our department. The training was very educational as it focused on cases studies, real world testimonials, legal updates, and best practices. I was able to network with other agency chiefs, PIO's (etc.) from across the country.

Administration Council Update  
August 2022

- SR 161 project administration:
  - Supplement funding paperwork to WSDOT headquarters
  - Contracts, bonds, insurance & DBE paperwork coord.
  - Preconstruction conference
  - Reviewed the construction schedule;
  - Working out issues for acceptable power pole relocation spots.
  - Distributed flyer, coordinated a web page for public information
- Lytle Short Plat: Approved performance bond and process forward for the final plat, civil construction and building permitting.
- Landfill:
  - Site Remedial Investigation and the Feasibility Study will be wrapping up soon.
  - Preparing for an interlocal agency agreement amendment to cover some biological investigation required to determine a solution on what needs to be done for the wetland at the toe of the landfill.
- Street Grant applications:
  - Coordinated assistance; completed and submitted three grants
    - View Crest Drive for roadway reconstruction
    - Pedestrian Improvements for Center Street W from Conant St to Cedar.
    - Grind, patch and overlay Center Street West, Weyer. Rd – east Town limits.
- Grant applications for Stream bank armor Grant applic: \$1.1 million
- Grant applications for Replacing water mains in Wash. Ave N and Center E. to Madison. \$1.45 million
