Amy Cruver graciously donated \$28,000 to the Town with the goal of purchasing and installing a piece of Dan Klennert art. We have been able to negotiate the purchase of one of Dan's train train sculptures for \$30,000. A picture of this sculpture is attached. The forecast for the overall cost of purchasing, moving and installing this sculpture is \$34,000:

\$28,000 has already been donated by Pierce County for this project which leaves an additional \$6,000 to be paid by the Town. Insurance is \$2.00 per thousand of evaluation so insurance would cost \$60.00. An installation location is still being discussed somewhere on Mashell Ave or possibly between Washington Ave and Mashell Ave

To Mayor David Baublits and Eatonville Town Council:

This letter is being offered in response to a request for comments from the Eatonville Main Street Association (EMSA) regarding the planned purchase of a steam locomotive sculpture by local artist Dan Klennert.

There was consensus among members of the EMSA working group present at our meeting on 9-19-23, that the opportunity to purchase an art sculpture with the Pierce County grant could be an attraction to our community, which is relevant to our efforts to attract tourism in our downtown area, even though it is not part of EMSA's more incremental approach to revitalizing businesses along Eatonville's traditional main street. This approach involves historical preservation and interpretation, beautification, community events, collaboration with other local groups and entities, plantings, creation of gathering spaces, and expressions of local art and culture.

We acknowledge Mayor Baublits' urging for our EMSA committee, as a revitalization organization, to help determine where the art sculpture would go, and are happy to continue our involvement in discussions on that topic.

One location being considered is in front of the Visitors Center, at the east end of the rain garden, bordering the sidewalk, where currently, a memorial tree stands. The dogwood tree, planted by the Dogwood Garden Club in 2017 in honor of prominent local citizen, the late Vera Byrd, has failed to thrive in this location. Irrespective of the decision on whether the sculpture is placed there, we understand the Dogwood Garden Club has requested that, if the tree is moved to a more appropriate spot, an arborist be involved in that process to ensure the best possible conditions for the tree – itself a symbol of incremental place-making – to thrive.

While the large investment in a single piece of art runs counter to the Main Street America vision of incremental/sustainable development, we value art – especially local art – in public spaces, and so are grateful to Pierce County for this opportunity. We are also grateful that the Town of Eatonville is willing to collaborate with EMSA in establishing the best placement possible for this piece of art.
