General

Public Safety Committee – no meeting in September

Management Activities

In September, I attended reoccurring monthly meetings such as the Pierce County Chief's Association, Eatonville Steering Committee, Eatonville Business Association, Coffee with the Chiefs, South Sound Regional Training Group, WASPC legislative briefings, the south sound law enforcement breakfast, and the Eatonville School District Safety Committee.

Flock has installed our 11th and final camera located at the northern town limits near Eatonville Licensing. Flock captures an average of 20,000 cars per weekday and 24,000 on the weekend days. Our 60-day trial period begins as of September 29th, 2023. I will continue to evaluate the data and make a recommendation on which and how many cameras to keep after the trial.

Officer Anderson and I worked part time at this year's Washington State Fair (WSF). The WSF relies on regional resources to provide a safe environment for its attendees as the Puyallup Police Department does not have the personnel to effectively staff this event. Participating police agencies include Bonney Lake Police, Sumner Police, Buckley Police, Lakewood Police, Pacific Police, the Pierce County Sheriff's Department, and Orting Police.

After a year of delays, we took delivery of our Motorola radio equipment to be installed in our pool, patrol car. The car will also be receiving EPD graphics.

I was interviewed by the Dispatch, along with Superintendent Jay Brower, regarding the active shooter training we provided the school district. IT highlighted our professional, cooperative relationship, and dedication to school safety. The released article was well articulated and favorable.
