Management Activities

In October, I attended reoccurring monthly meetings such as the Pierce County Chief's Association, Eatonville Steering Committee, Eatonville Business Association, Coffee with the Chiefs, South Sound Regional Training Group, WASPC legislative briefings, the south sound law enforcement breakfast, and the Eatonville School District Safety Committee.

On October 18th, Officer McGuire and I attended Pizza Wednesday at Myles Pizza Depot. There were approximately 300 students in attendance. I handed out about 250 EPD badge stickers to students and enjoyed many conversations with students and parents.

On October 26th, Officers Justman, McGuire, and I provided ALICE (active shooter response) training to 20 Eatonville School District substitute teachers and volunteers.

On October 31st we took delivery of the new laptops for our officers. We are appreciative to the mayor and council for approving AARPA funds for this purchase.

On October 26th our new I.T. contract with South Sound 911 went into effect. We look forward to this new partnership.

We are continuing our transition from Bonney Lake courts to Pierce County District Courts for prosecutorial services for infractions and misdemeanor crimes. The transition is expected to be completed by January 1, 2024.

SOUTH PIERCE FIRE & RESCUE

- FF/PM Danielle Stumpf is on board as of October 1st and the three remaining new FF/PM's will start the Washington State Fire Academy, starting on January 25th.
- Fire & Emergency Services contract negotiations remain in process.
- CVA 23-2 is ongoing with members from SPFR, Browns Point, Ashford Elbe, and Riverside.
