**Public Safety Committee – no meeting in November**

### Management Activities

In November, I attended reoccurring monthly meetings such as the Pierce County Chief's Association, Eatonville Steering Committee, Eatonville Business Association, Coffee with the Chiefs, South Sound Regional Training Group, WASPC legislative briefings, the south sound law enforcement breakfast, and the Eatonville School District Safety Committee.

On November 1st, I presented the EPD Core Value Award to 3 students at Eatonville Middle School. This program recognizes students who exemplify and have displayed one or all of EPD's core values, Professionalism, Ethics, Accountability, Compassion, and Excellence. Each student received a department challenge coin and a certificate.

On November 5<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup>, I attended the fall Washington Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC) conference. I attended a multitude of lectures ranging from a use of force forum to updates on legislative changes and proposed bills. I found the networking portion of this conference invaluable.

On November 15<sup>th</sup>, I participated in Pizza Wednesday at Myles Pizza Depot. I was accompanied by ESD Superintendent, Jay Brower. WE served approximately 300 kids slices of pizza.

We are continuing our transition from Bonney Lake courts to Pierce County District Courts for prosecutorial services for infractions and misdemeanor crimes. The transition is expected to be completed by January 1, 2024.

Other projects we have been working on:

Had a routine service disconnect for a residence. Turned into a couple hour outage on a small section of town. We noticed the primary wire on the pole was damaged and decided to get ahead of it and make the repair.

Finally able to make some changes on Madison Ave. and get the Mcfadden shop powered up. We had to set a temporary transformer in place while we are still waiting on our transformer order from Feb. 23

We had a couple fusing problems, but were able to correct them quickly. When these fuses melt instead of blowing out, it indicates a possible overload. Just one reason we need a load/fusing study.

We have been getting to some of the tree trimming that we can access. I'll be ordering tree trimming hot tools in '24', our old gear didn't pass dielectric testing.

It was a good month for the Power and Light Dept. We are starting to see some more of our much needed supplies show up. All in good time.
