MINUTES OF REGULAR

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor McFadden called the meeting of the Eatonville Town Council to order at 7:00 p.m.

ROLL CALL

Town Clerk Miranda Doll called the roll. The following were:

Present: Councilmembers Peter Paul, Mike Schaub, Bill Dunn and Colin Stephens.

Councilmember Paul made a motion to excuse Councilmember Litzenberger and was seconded by Councilmember Schaub. All were in favor.

Also Present: Mayor Emily McFadden, Town Clerk Miranda Doll and Town Administrator Eric Phillips.

OPENING CEREMONIES

Mayor McFadden led the assembly in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA/SET TIME RESTRICTIONS

Councilmember Paul moved approval of agenda with a three-minute time limit and was seconded by Councilmember Stephens. All were in favor.

COMMENTS FROM CITIZENS

Audrey Roley – 48513 144th Ave E, she is a member of the Historical Society and wanted to discuss the status of the old fire truck so they can make some repairs and get it running for the 4th of July parade.

Councilmember Dunn made a motion to approve the consent agenda and was seconded by Councilmember Schaub. All were in favor.

DEPARTMENT HEAD/COUNCIL COMMITTEE/BOARD/COMMISSION REPORT

- A. Public Works Report** – Town Administrator Eric Phillips gave Council an update on the Millpond Park Improvements. He also let them know the Town might be able to utilize Sourcewell for some general contracting for this project. He has also gotten the draft Fire Dept lease to SPFR and they will be taking it before their board at their next meeting.
- B. Mayor's Report** – Mayor McFadden let Council know we will be bringing forward the lease for the antique fire truck to the next Council meeting. She also let them know about an event that took place on Friday that led her to close Town Hall for safety concerns.

MILLPOND PARK PLAN REIVEW

Town Administrator Eric Phillips discussed the funding shortage for the Millpond Park Improvement Project and gave them the options of shortening the fence around the basketball court or making a smaller court. The Council would like to see the project remain as it was designed using additional Town funding in the amount of \$24,000 if possible.

ORDINANCE 2026-2 – FIRST READING

An Ordinance of the Town of Eatonville, Washington, repealing and reenacting Eatonville Municipal Code Sections 18.04.185 and 18.04.187 and adopting codes more conducive to airport ground operations safety and land use compatibility.

Town Clerk Miranda Doll read the Ordinance by title into the record.

Councilmember Paul made a motion to approve the first reading of Ordinance 2026-2. Motion died for lack of second.

COUNCIL MEMBER COMMENTS

Councilmember Paul thanked Ms. Roley for coming and speaking and let everyone know there is a Public Utilities Committee meeting this Wednesday at 4:00pm.

Councilmember Dunn would like to see the draft Fire Department Agreement.

Councilmember Stephens would also like a copy of the draft agreement and thanked Councilmember Paul for his efforts in picking up garbage.

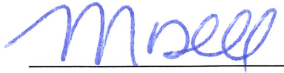
ADJOURNMENT
