PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Expansion of campus facilities and incident inconveniences due to building on campus have marked this school year. Certainly we are all happy to adapt to these inconveniences because the facilities that are being provided are so much needed and so much wanted.

As we open the school year of 1958-59, we will be occupying for the first time a new physical education plant for men, the first unit of a larger development which will at a future date include women's facilities also and, we hope, an inclosed swimming pool. As school opens in the fall we will also occupy the first unit of a new dormitory for women. This new dormitory will carry the name of Dorion Hall and all of the present dormitory facilities, the old Dorion and Hunt, will carry the name of Hunt Hall and will serve men students exclusively. A further development on the campus is the installation of a central heating plant. This project has brought us more inconvenience than the other two because it has necessitated the running of steam lines across campus to connect all buildings. The scars of this work, however, will soon be healed with new turf and new sidewalks.

As we write this message, we have just been authorized by the State Board of Higher Education to retain an architect and begin study of preliminary plans for the enlargement of Hoke Hall to provide more classroom space and more student facilities.

The year has been marked by one other major accomplishment. The State Board of Higher Education has granted to the three colleges, Southern Oregon College, Oregon College of Education, and Eastern Oregon College a Master of Science degree in secondary education. This rounds out our offerings at Eastern Oregon College to include the Bachelor of Science and Master of Science in both elementary and secondary teacher training and a Bachelor of Science in General Studies. These degree programs are in addition to the terminal-course work and professional work presently offered at the college.

Our staff for next year is being enlarged by three additional members and this, with our new program and new buildings, will leave us in a position of increased strength to serve our regional area.

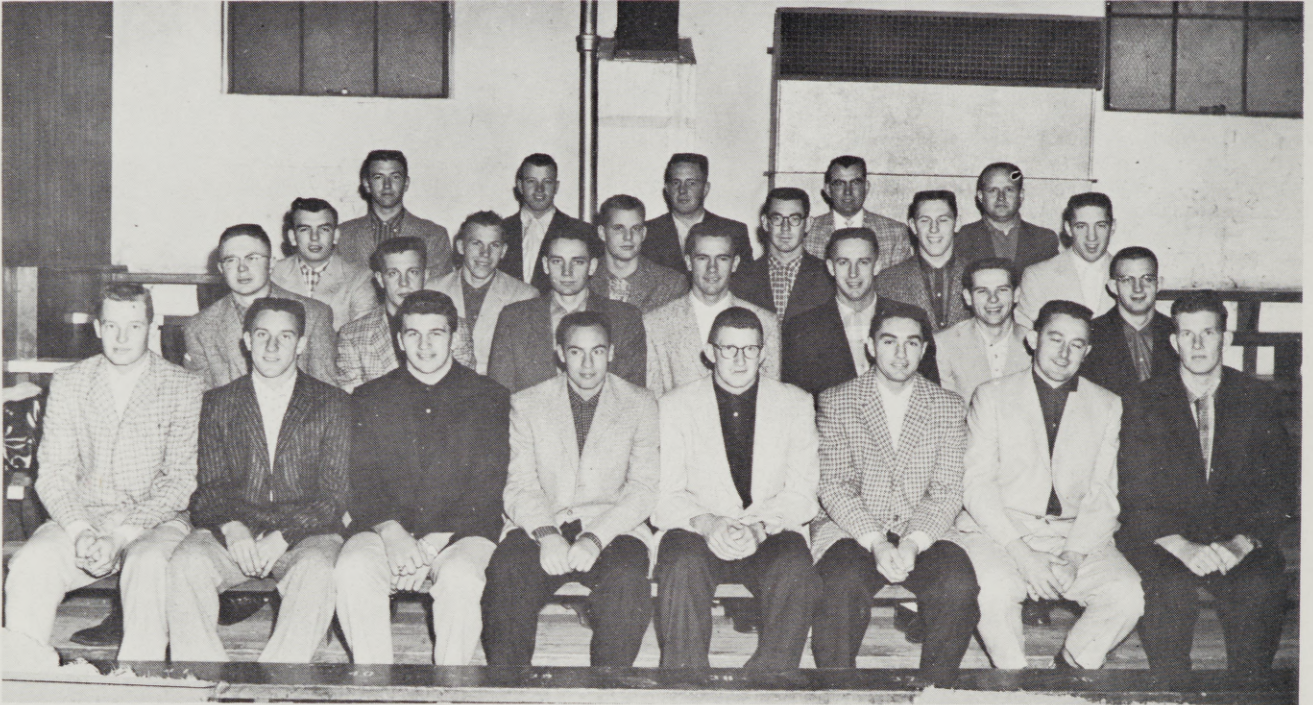
Beacon Staff
