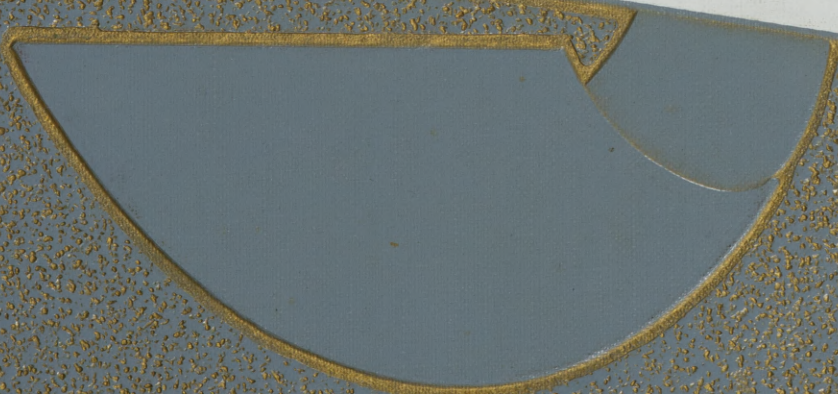
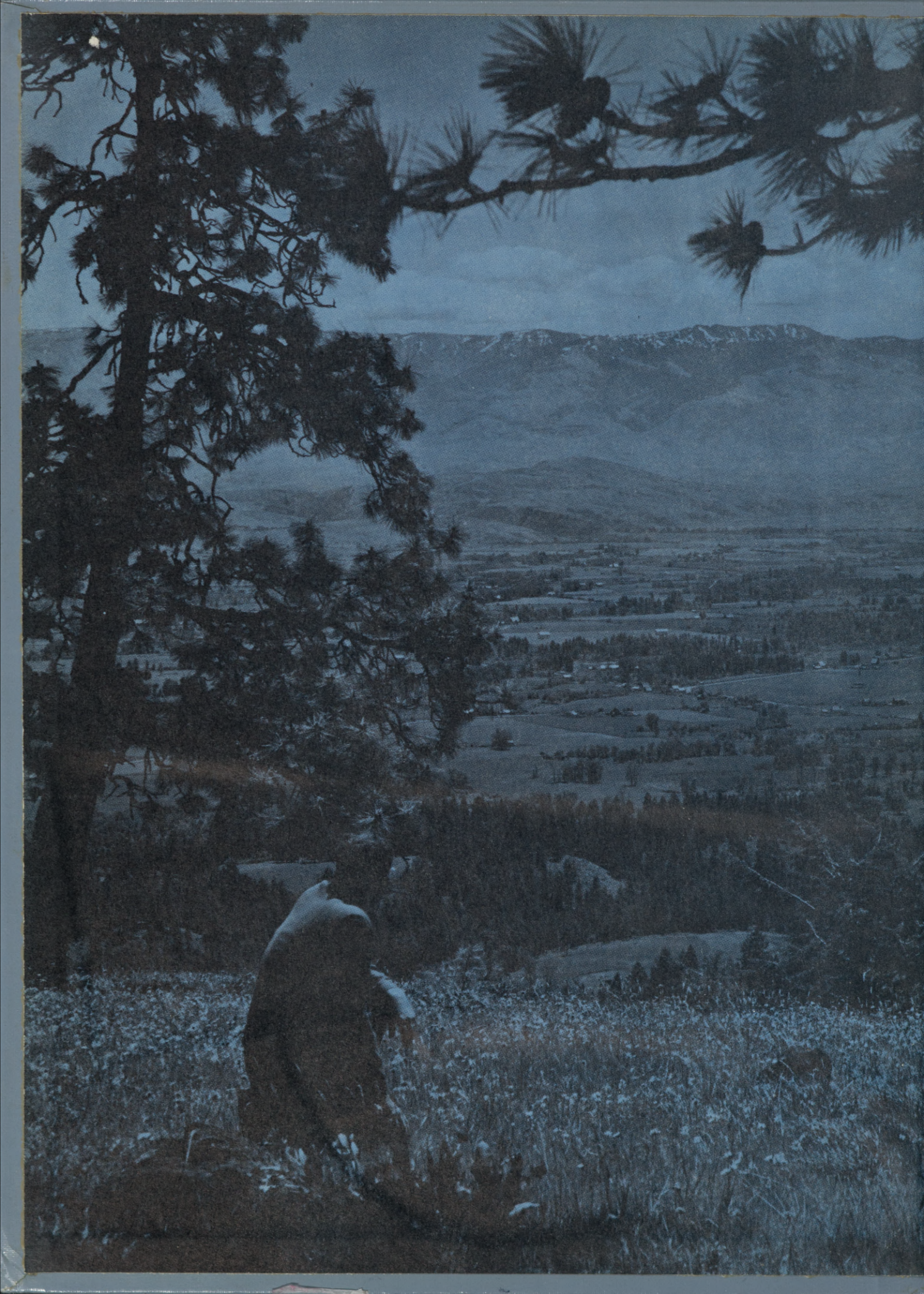

# FROM THESE ROOTS GREW EASTERN OREGON COLLEGE

In an awe-inspiring setting among snow-capped mountains, surrounded by fertile valleys green with grain, Eastern Oregon College has put down deep roots and grown. It has drawn strength from its local environment, then has reached out to embrace a region. From vast Malheur County where the Steens lure mountain climbers, to where the Snake roars through its chasm toward the Columbia, from the borders of Idaho, to where they have harnessed the Columbia at the Dalles, Eastern Oregon College has drawn strength. Forever renewed she will continue to grow, to serve the region that sustains her.



### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

During the current year we have greatly enjoyed our new building facilities. The first unit of our physical education plant, the men's physical education unit which includes a fine new health center, four classrooms and a gymnasium, is a real addition to our campus facilities and program. The first unit of the women's dormitory, the new Dorion Hall, has provided excellent housing for our women students and was a much-needed improvement. The campus development incident to these new buildings also has added much to the attractiveness of the campus. A beautiful, useful campus parking area has been provided in what once was a wilderness of old shacks and debris.

Further development is scheduled for next year as the city begins its two-year street improvement program on campus. During these two years, we expect to have all unpaved streets on campus north of "G" Avenue improved and paved.

At this writing we await final action by the legislature on our hoped-for addition to and other improvements at Hoke Hall. Enrollment has continued its steady increase and promises continued increase. Needed curriculum additions in upper division and graduate work have been approved for us, while the right to grant the Bachelor of Arts degree is our newest privilege.

As we move forward to the future, we anticipate additional campus improvement. We anticipate a new science building, a women's addition and swimming pool at the physical education plant, and additional dormitory space. All of these are possibilities for the 1961-63 biennium.

Staff enlargement commensurate with our growth is being made and the college program continues its direction toward more adequate service to the regional needs of eastern Oregon.

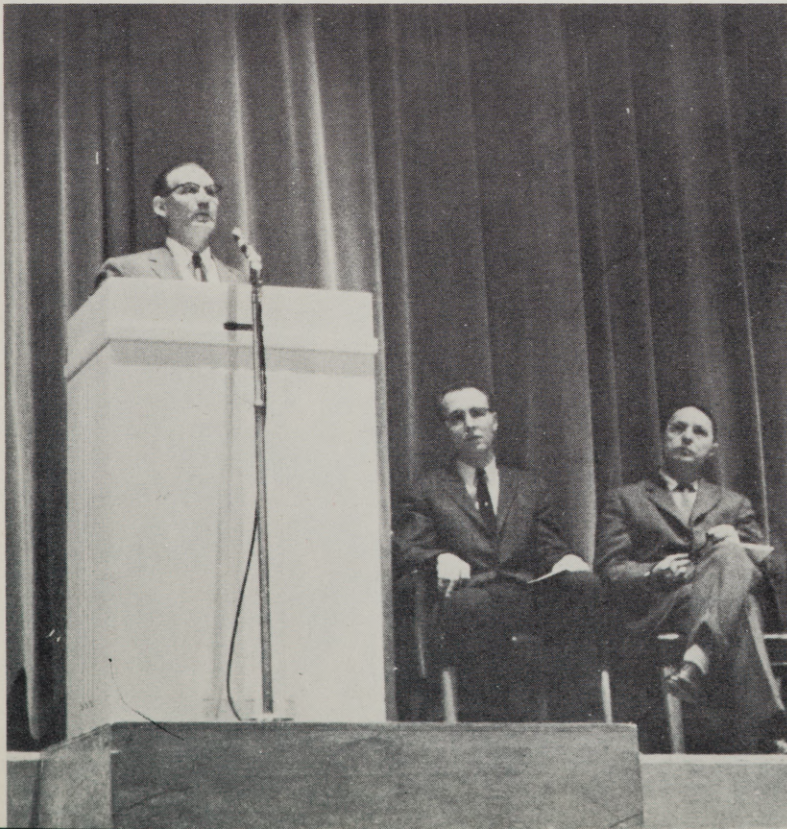


Eastern Oregon's Annual Religion in Life Conference is planned each year by the College Interfaith Fellowship and is held during National Brotherhood Week. Dur-

## Lettermen's Club

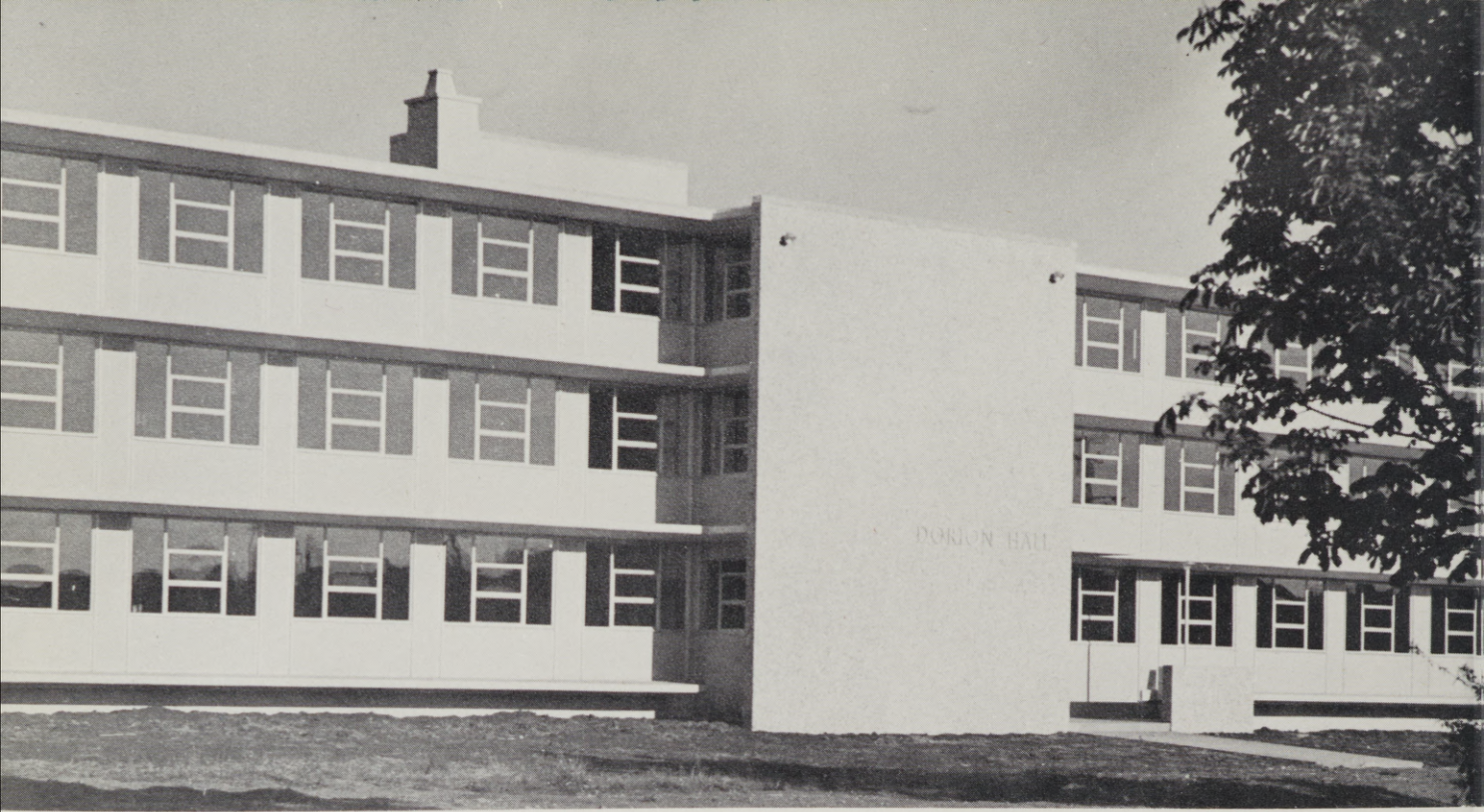
