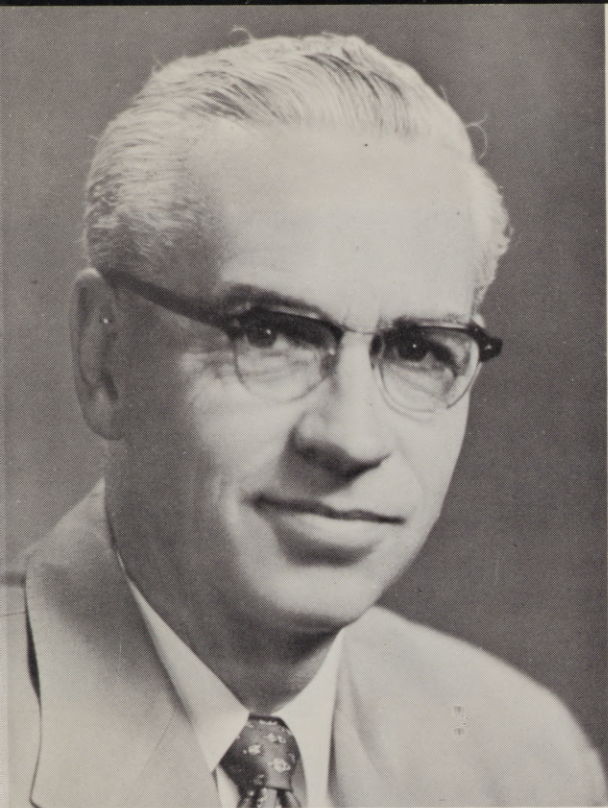


## **president's message**

Last year we celebrated our silver anniversary. In that year we were privileged to announce the new programs which added to our college offering secondary teacher education and liberal arts with a degree of bachelor of science in general studies. This year we have reaped the harvest of last year's publicity and of the new program that is now in its junior year. A year ago we had 382 students registered in the freshman, sophomore, junior and senior years. This year we had 455 or a growth of 19.1 per cent. Our total enrollment as of the second week of school, including auditors, was 529 as compared with the previous year's enrollment of 460. This was a total growth of 15 per cent. Our freshman class this year had 208 students. If this large a class moves along to become sophomores, juniors, and seniors in our four-year program, we will begin to experience a new status both in numbers and service as a four-year college.

We have just completed the building of a one-unit addition to our dormitories. Now we are studying the possibilities of a complete new dormitory for men and are hopeful that we may secure legislative appropriation for a new physical education plant. We have started our second 25 years with auspicious indications for growth and improved programs. Hopefully and confidently we look to the future.

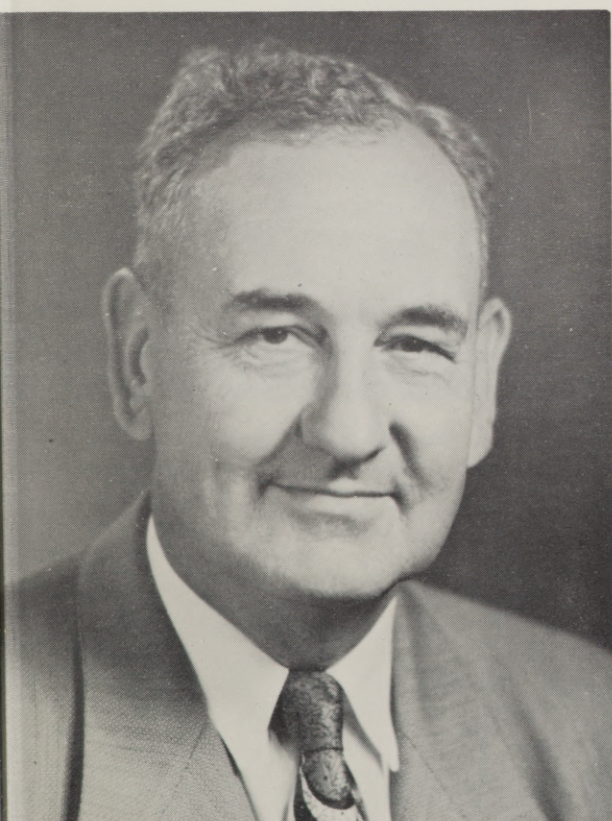

On December 17, 1954, seven legislators from eastern Oregon gathered on the Eastern Oregon College of Education campus to review with Chancellor Byrne and Vice-Chancellor Richards and representatives of the State Board of Higher Education the budgetary askings of the State Board of Higher Education for the biennium 1955-57. After a group luncheon, the legislators conferred concerning a breakdown analysis of the needs of the institutions of the State System of Higher Education. The EOC Mountaineers wound up a fairly successful basketball season, winning 18 games and losing only 10 to rank high in several categories of NAIA statistics for small colleges in the nation. The team placed eighth in free throwing by making over 71 per cent of their free throw attempts. In total offense, the team ranked eighth with a game average of approximately 88 points.

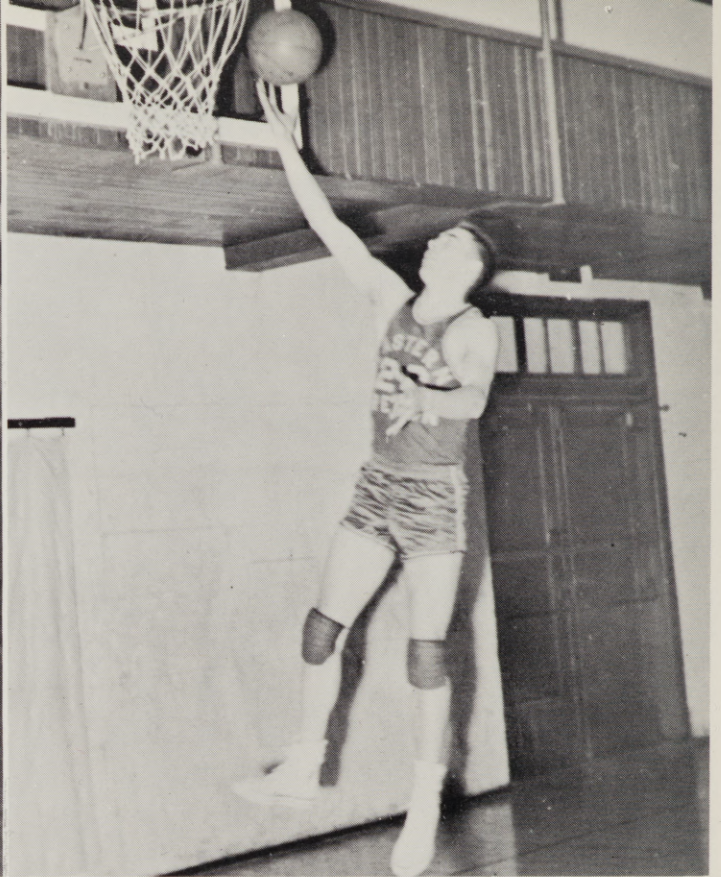
By taking second place in the Oregon Collegiate conference, the EOCenes gained the opportunity to compete in the NAIA district two tournament in Milwaukie. Although they lost their first game to Pacific U., the team won their consolation game against Willamette and also came home with the good sportsmanship trophy.

Adding to EOC's laurels was the selection of Ted Schadewitz, Larry Pryse, and John Reinking for All-Conference honors. In OCC play, Pryse captured top scoring honors for the season by scoring 350 points in the 16-game schedule. Schadewitz was third with 297, and Reinking seventh with 242.

Among all scorers in the Pacific Northwest Colleges during the season, Schedewitz was fourth with 601 points and Pryse fifth with 593. Reinking also made the top twenty with 380 points.



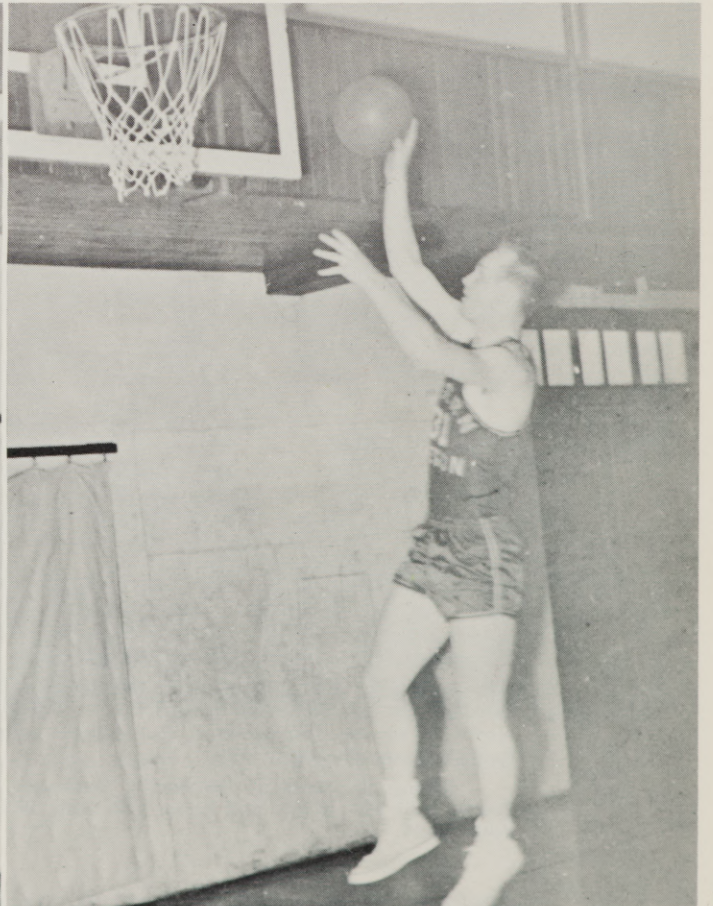

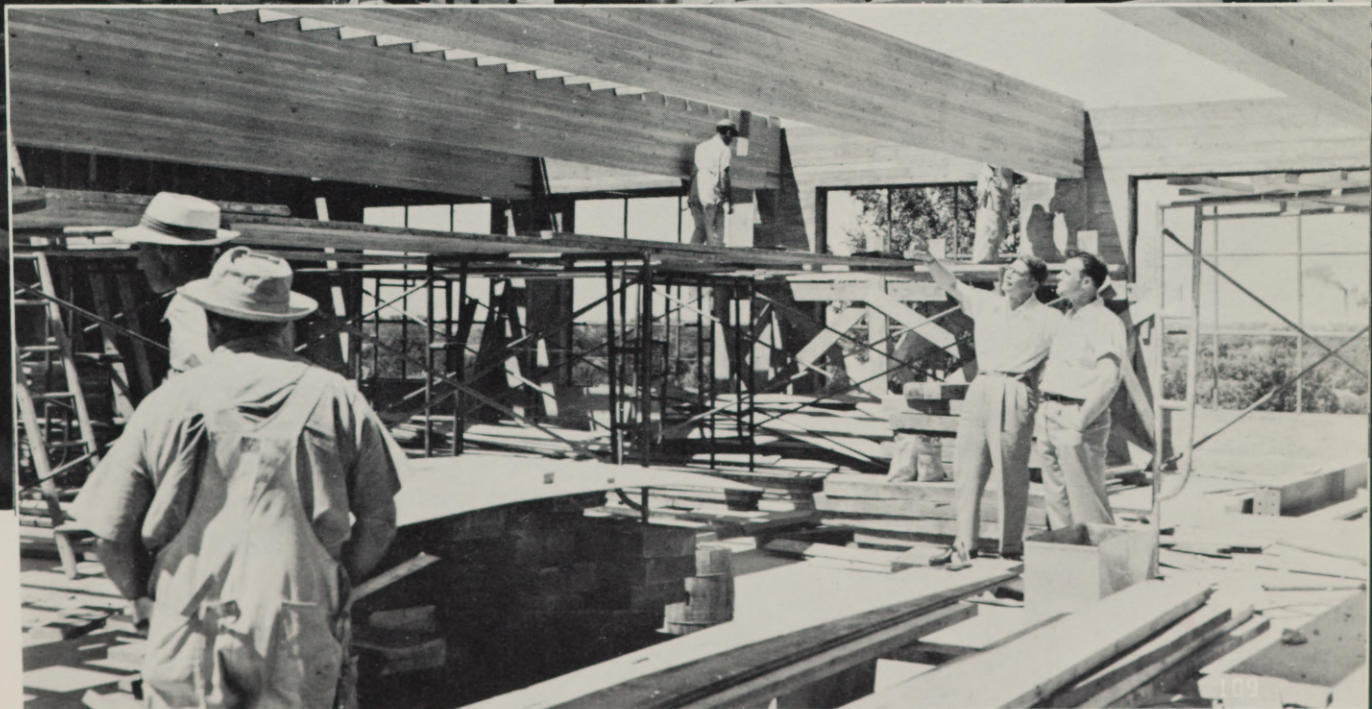
## baseball - 1954

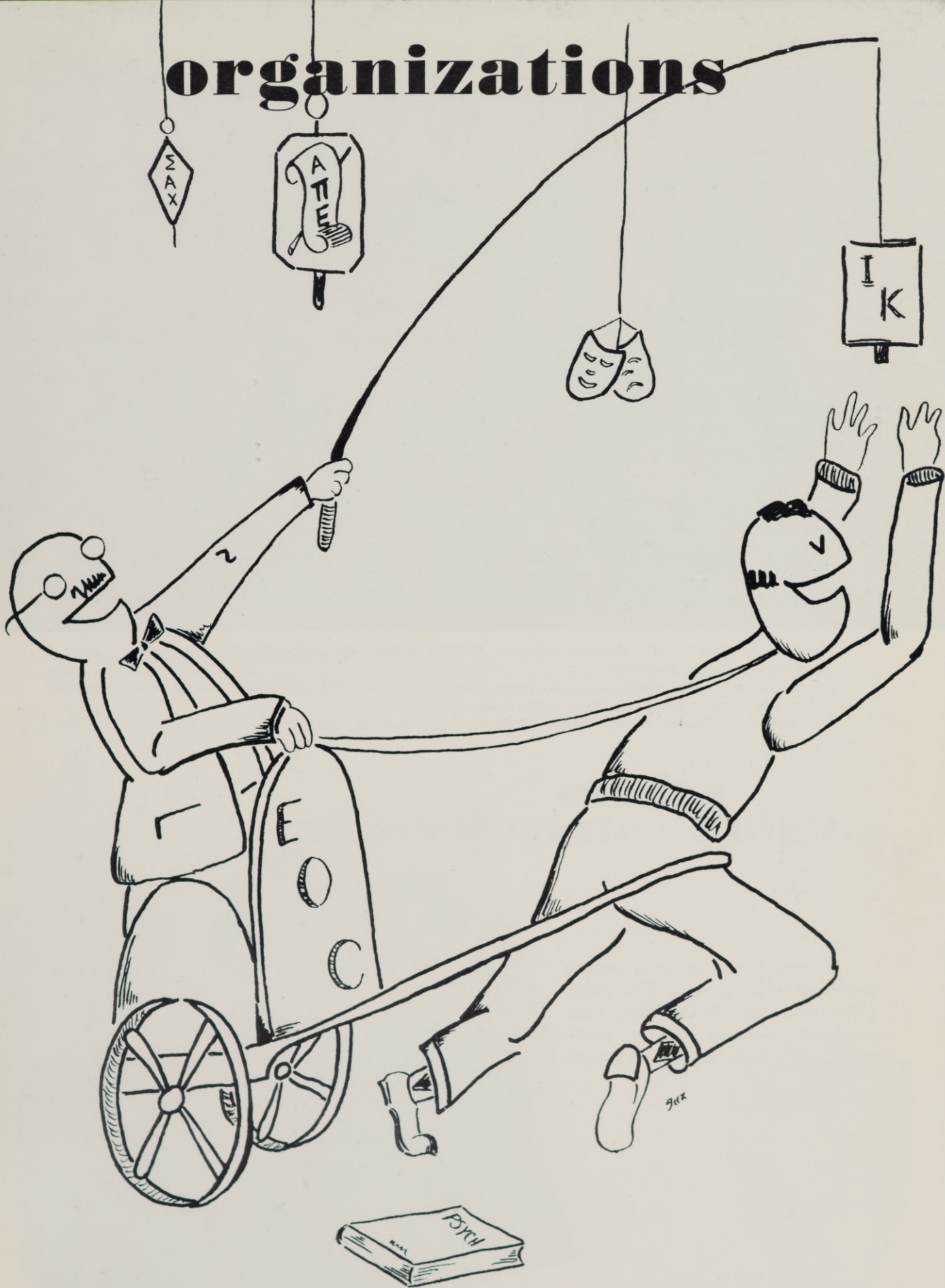

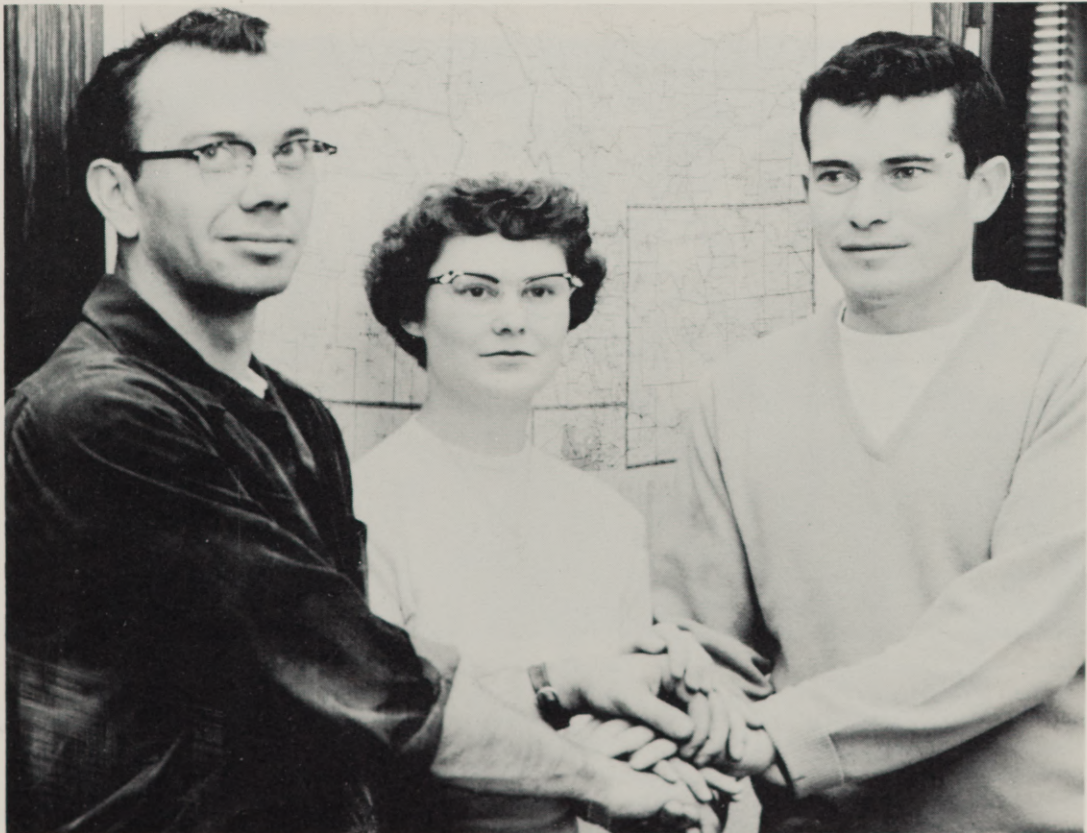

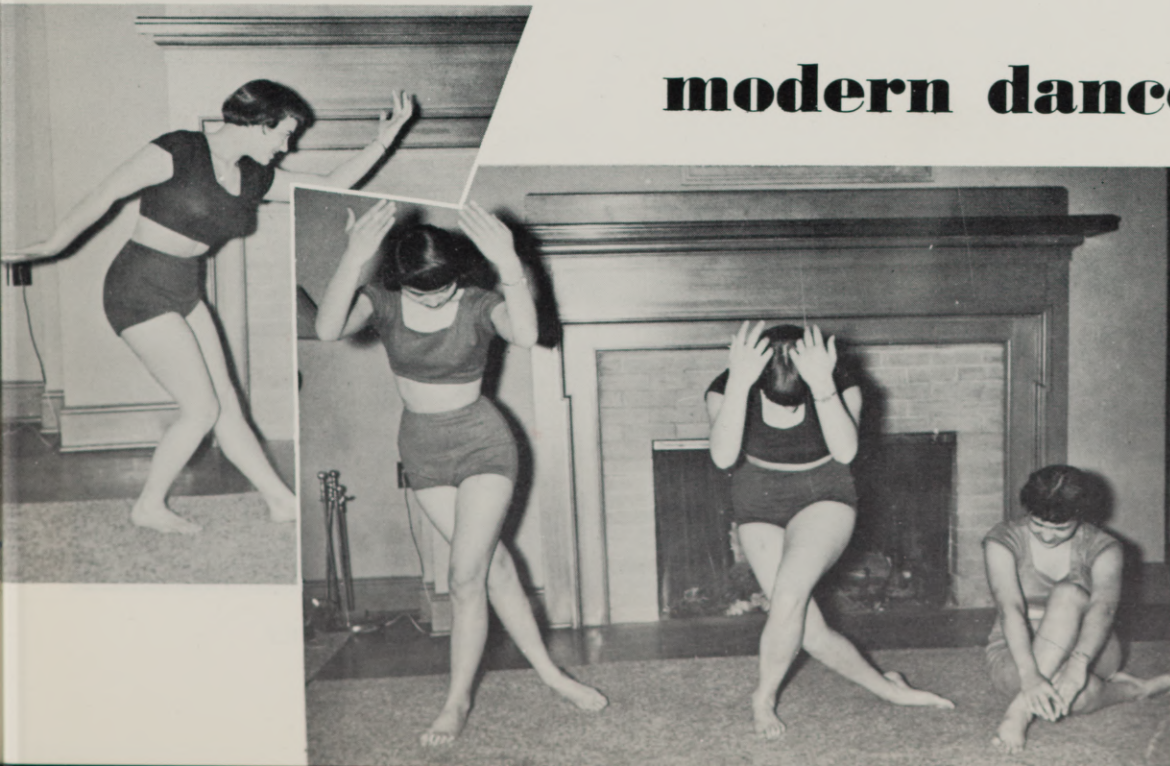
