

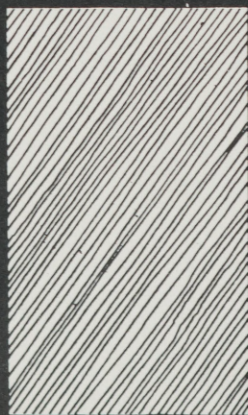

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Two fine campus improvements have been accomplished during the current year — one, the addition to Hoke Hall and the improvement of our student center facilities, and the second, the paving of a number of the streets in the heart of the campus and the removal from the grounds of the residence buildings that cluttered the area.

Our immediate building program for the future, now that Ballot Measure 6 has carried, will concentrate on more adequate student housing.

Two areas of academic concern are likewise receiving definite campus attention — one, a program of increased interest in research on the part of our staff members, and second, the serious consideration of an honors program for Eastern Oregon College. Each of these movements indicates a quickening interest in quality leadership and quality education.

Enrollment at the college continues upward and now substantially exceeds 800 students. We will soon be faced with the necessity for an additional classroom building on campus in addition to needed student housing.

Again we repeat, these new emphases have real meaning for both our college and our ability to increasingly serve our regional area through higher education.

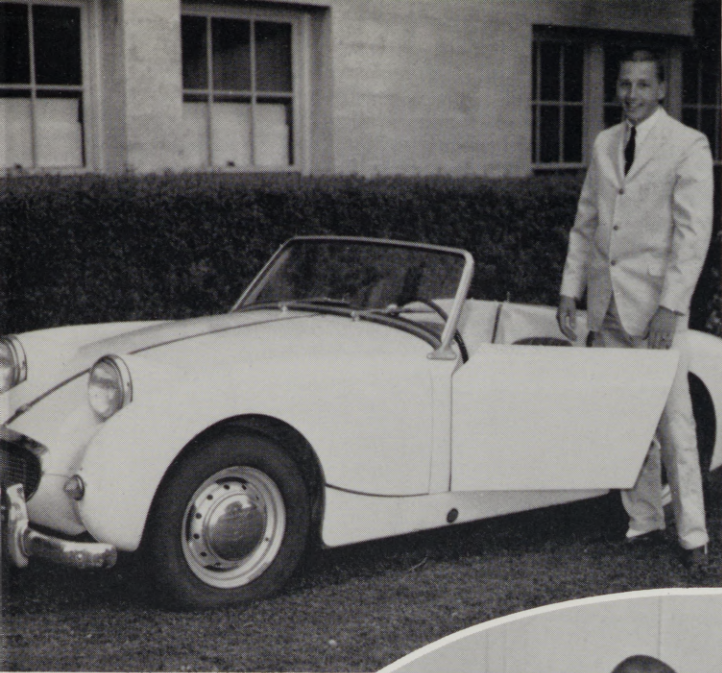
STUDENT GOVERNMENT

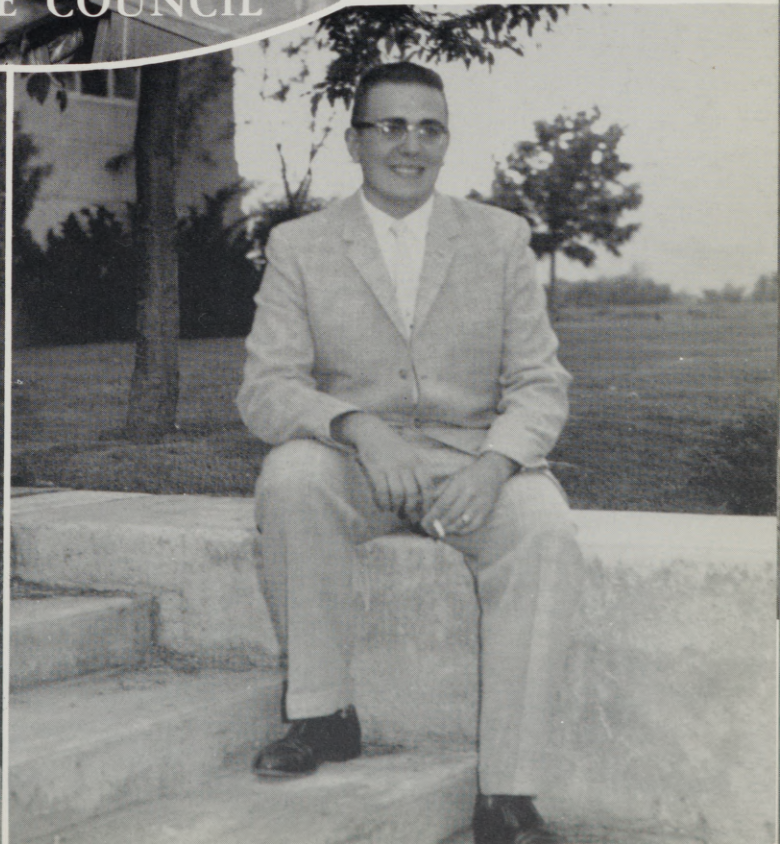

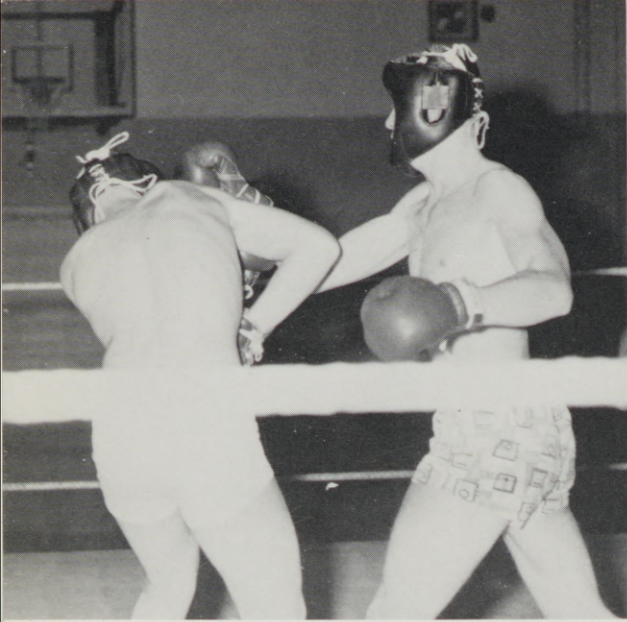

Pat is another of the boys who returned to playing football after a stay in the service. Pat is a 1957 graduate of La Grande High School where he lettered in football, track, and basketball.

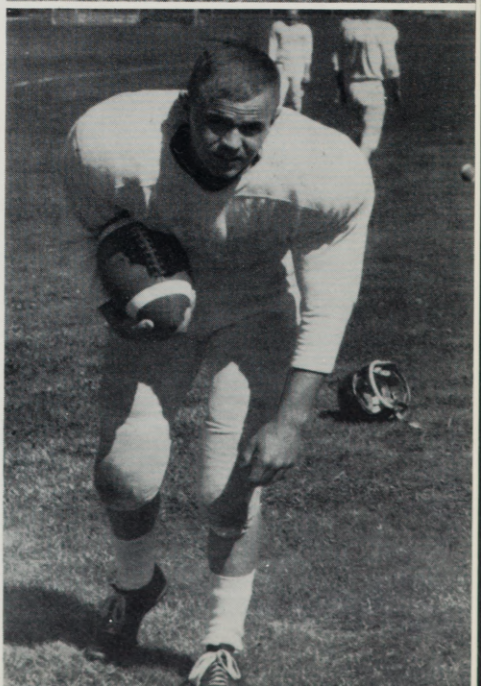
