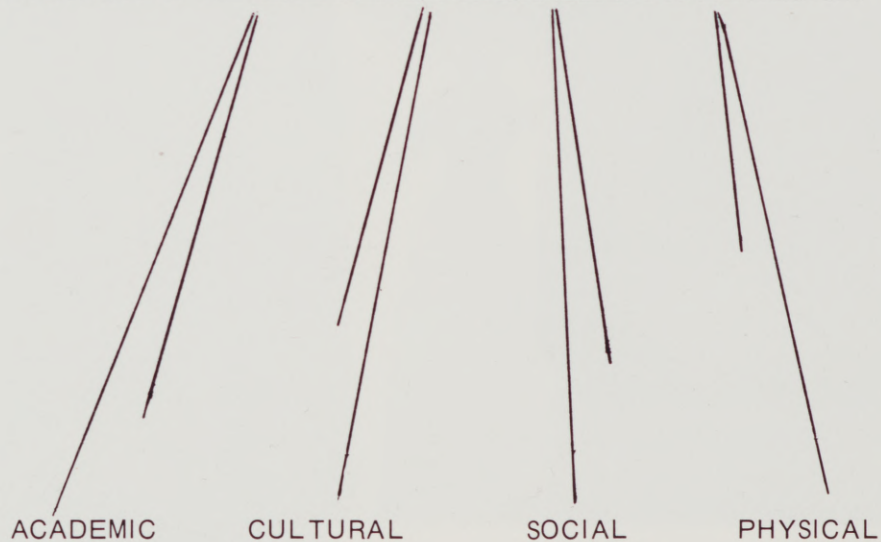

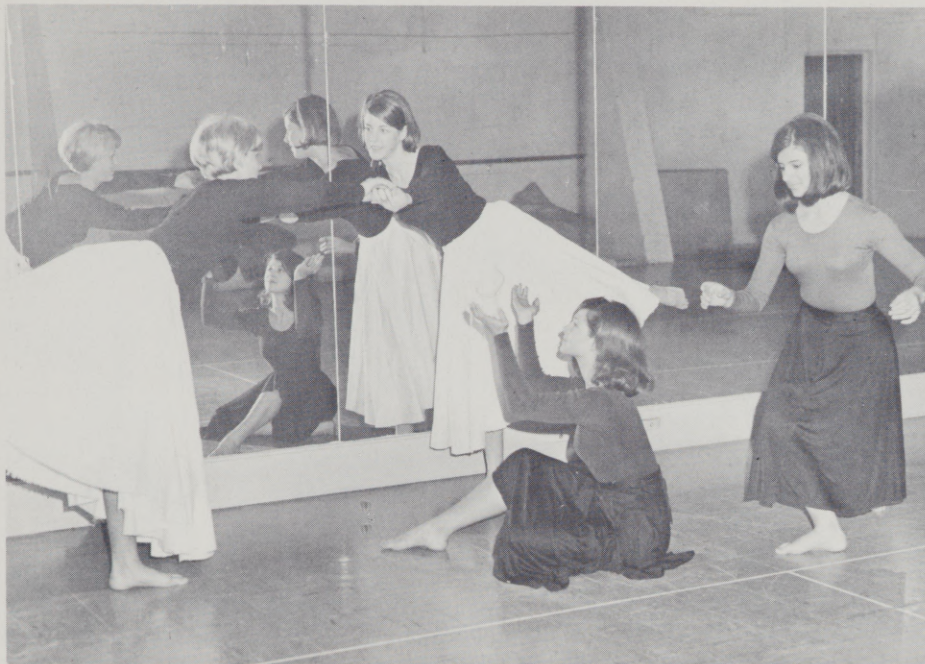

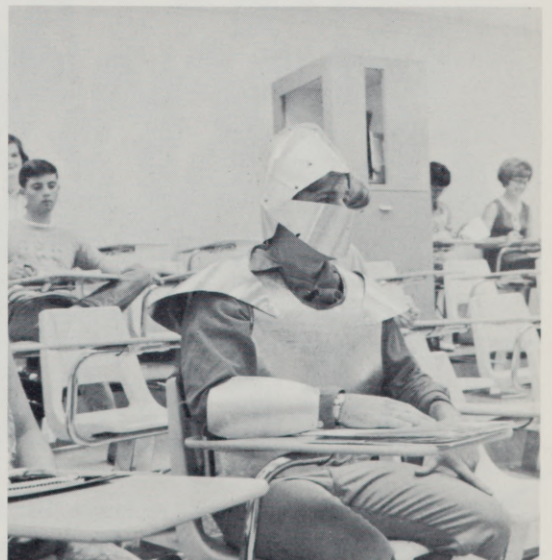

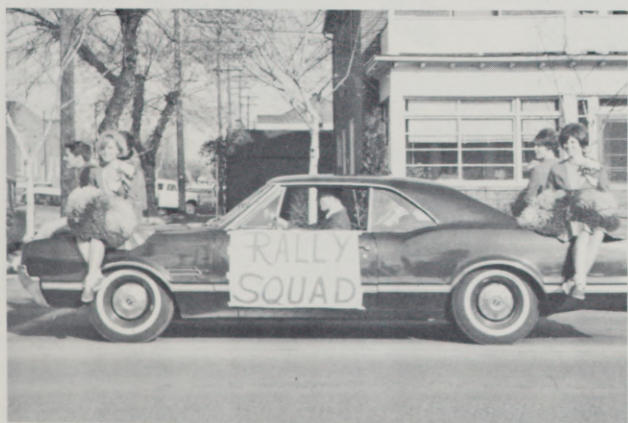

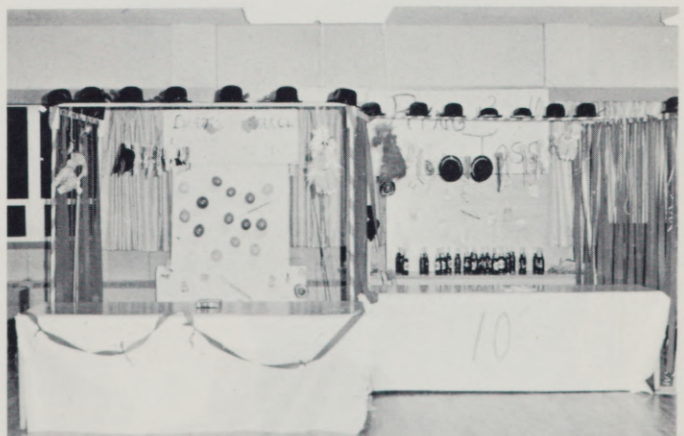

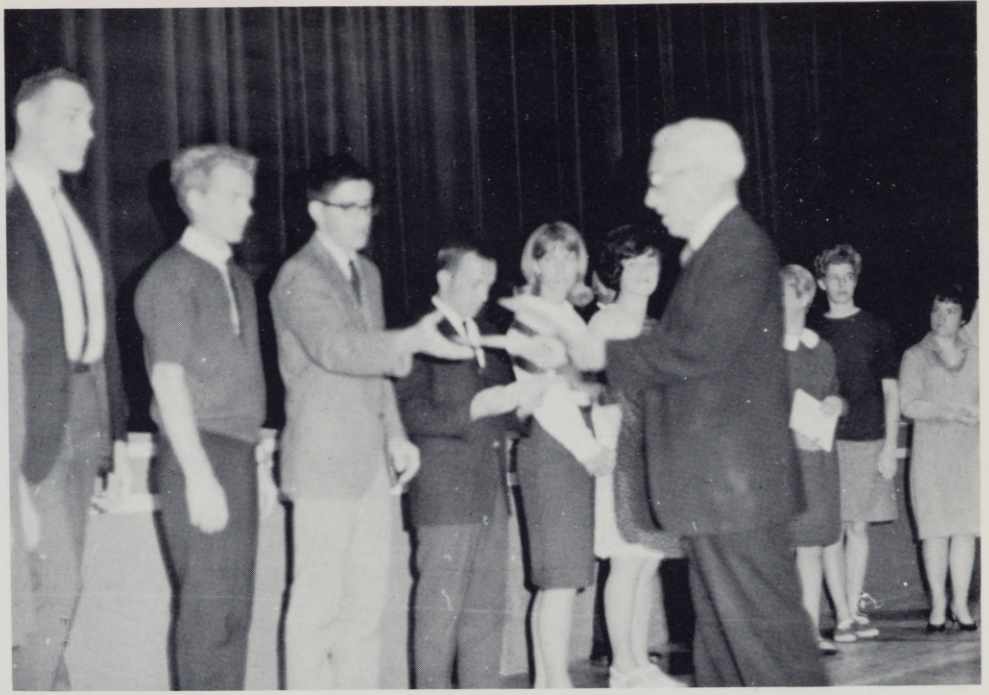

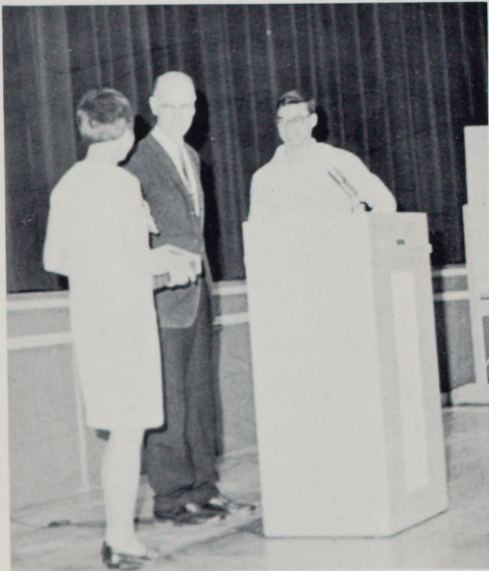

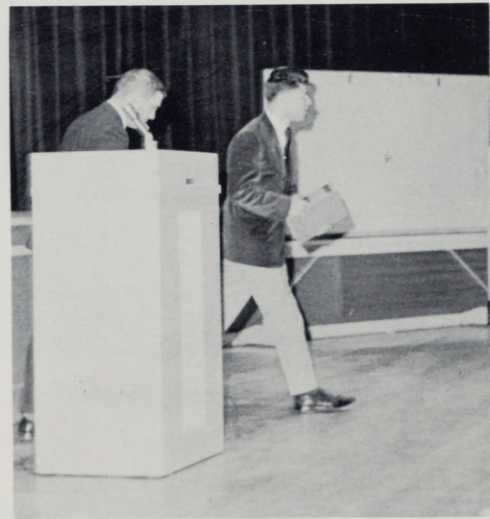

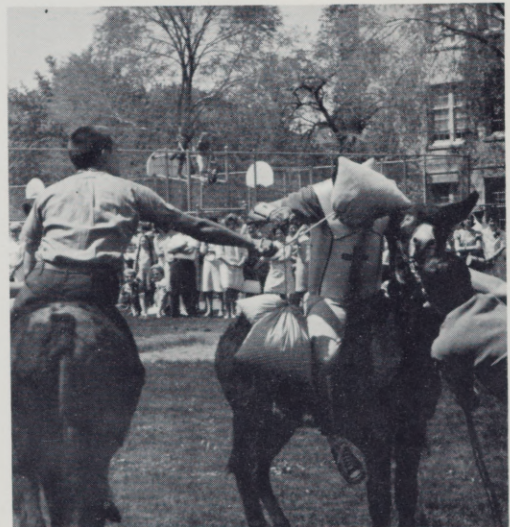

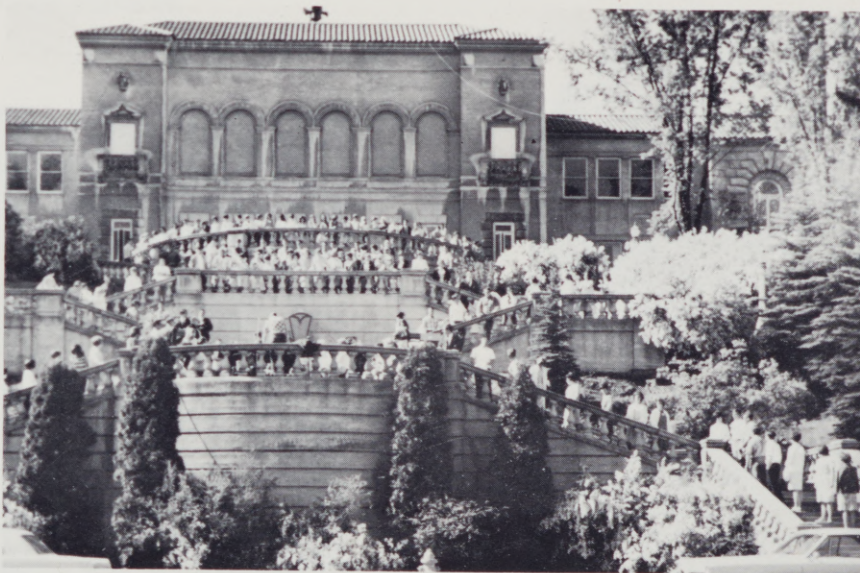

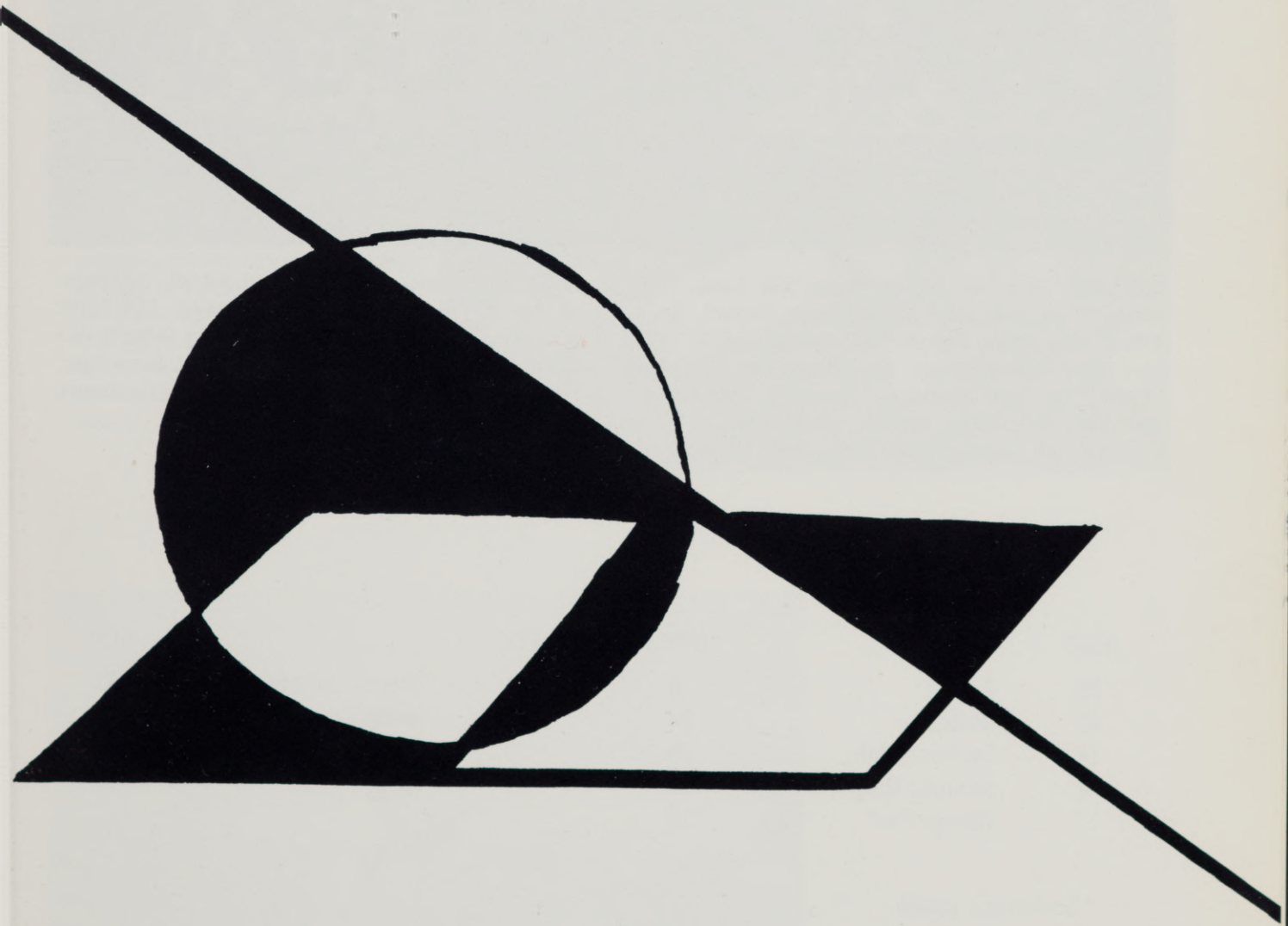

# FAREWELL



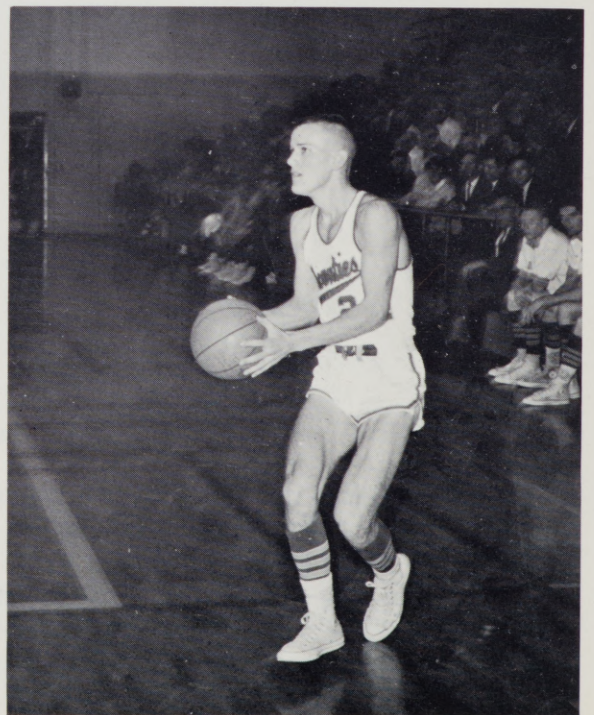
BOB QUINN has coached at E. O. C. since 1929. During that period, he coached football, baseball, and basketball until 1949 when he dropped football.

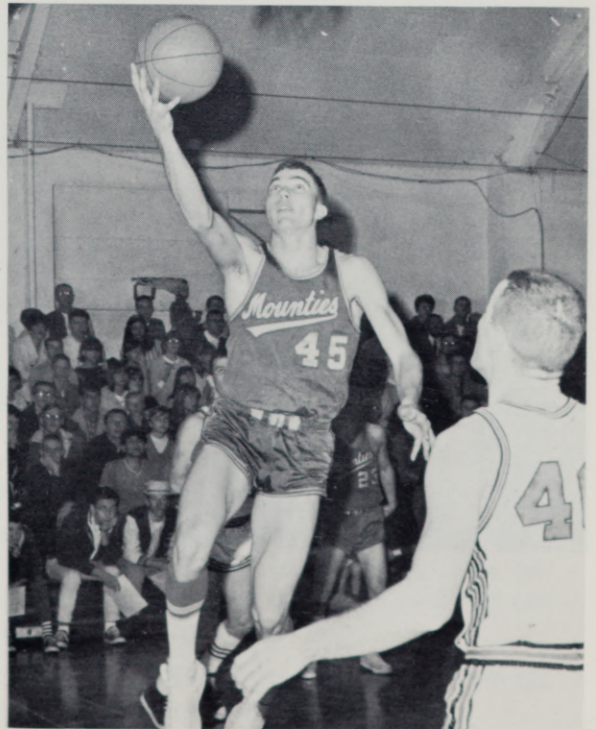

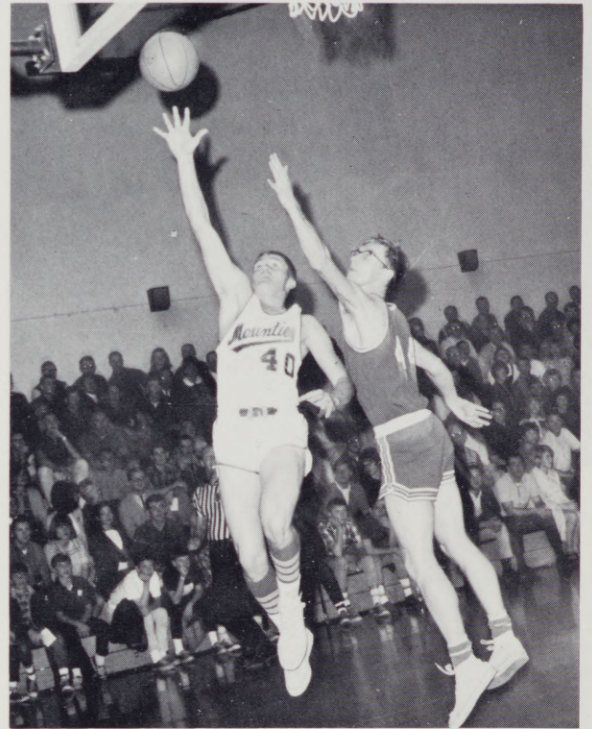
Bob Quinn was nominated to the N. A. I. A. Hall of Fame. And in 1964, he was nominated for the National Coach of the Year.

Throughout Coach Quinn's era at E. O. C., he has won a total of 450 games and in all these years he has never missed a game.

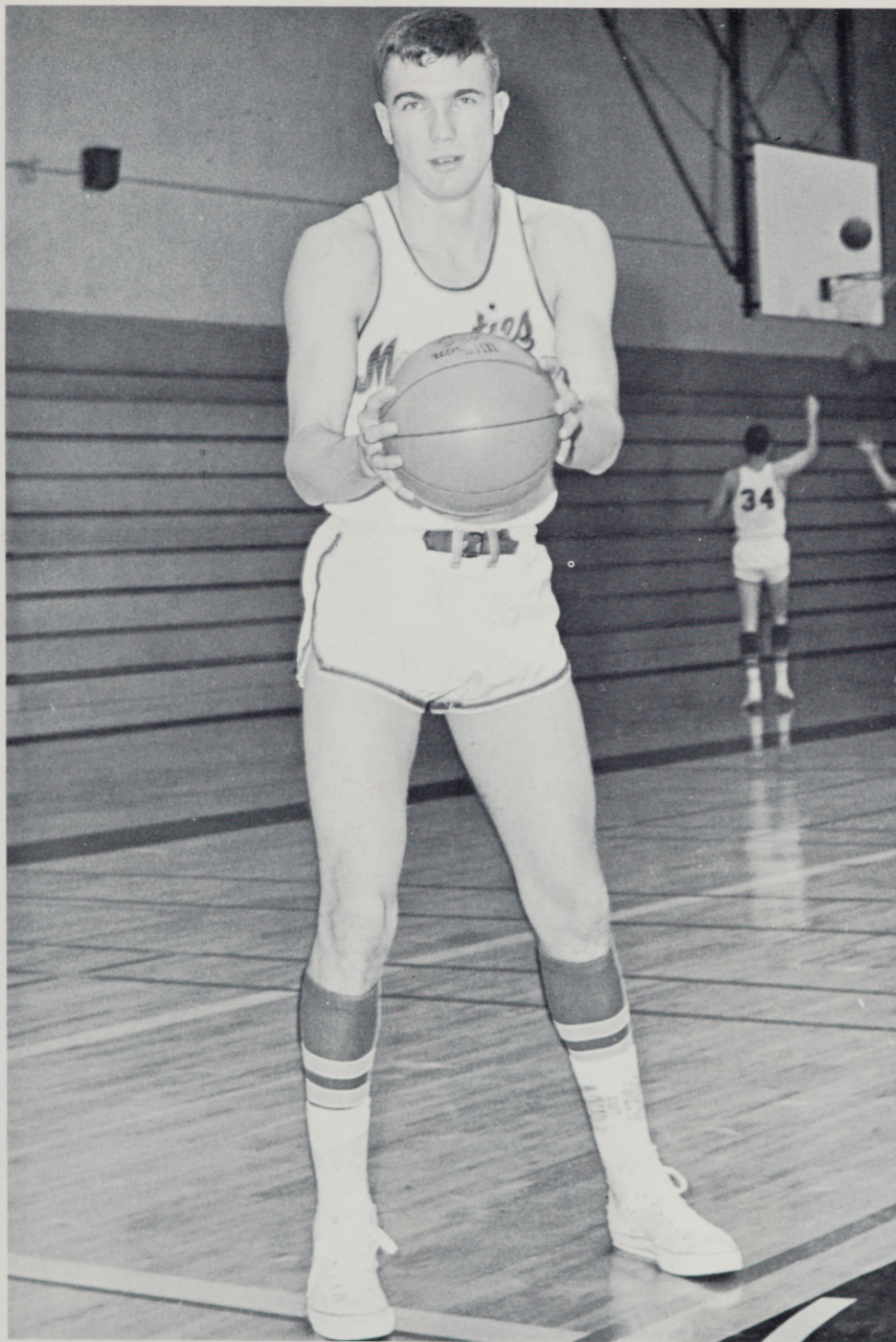

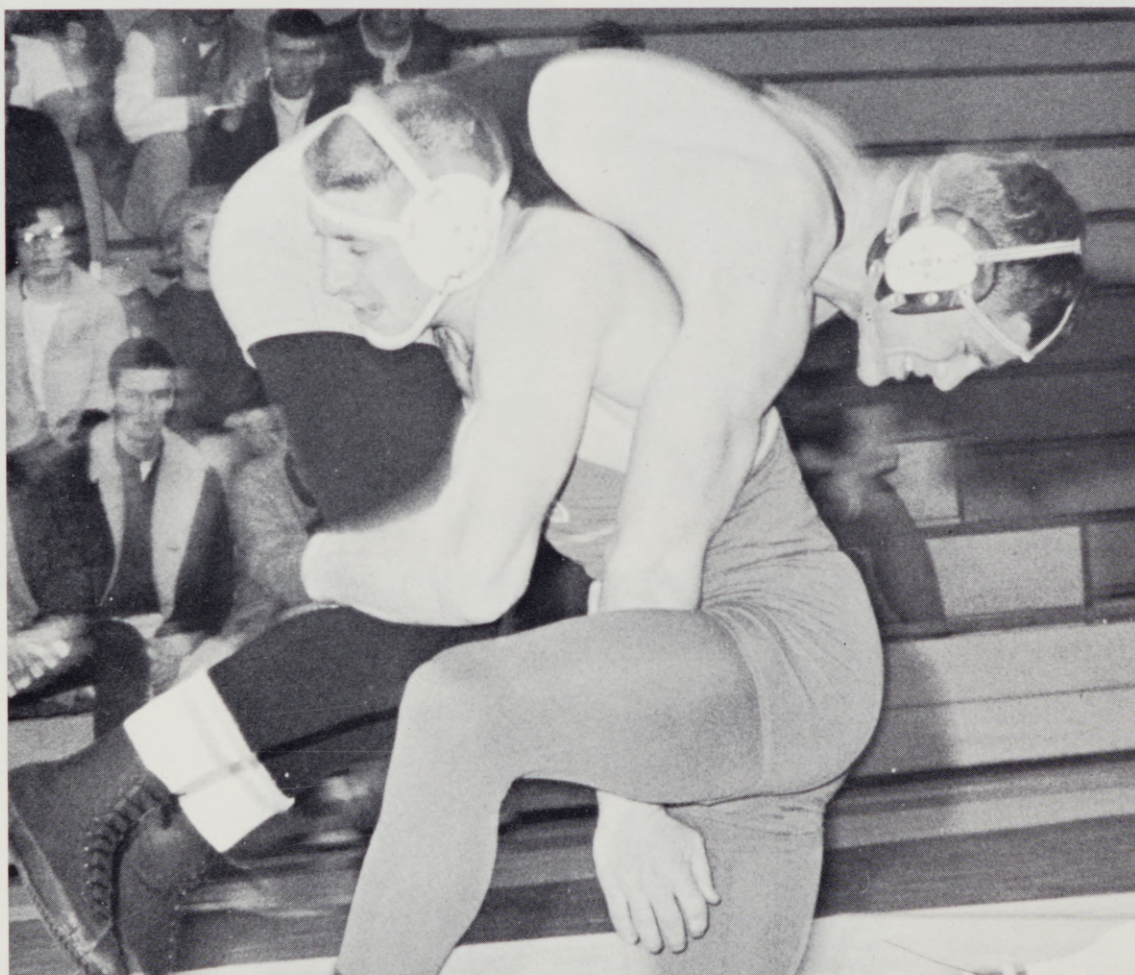


# WRESTLING ACTION
