Dr. Natalie Johnson is an Associate Professor of Criminal Justice at Dalton State College in Dalton, GA. Teaching almost 14 years, she teaches courses such as sex trafficking, labor and organ trafficking, family violence, victimology, and criminology.

Dr. Johnson serves on the Statewide Human Trafficking Taskforce in Georgia and is part of Workgroup I, which educates and provides awareness of human trafficking to the community. She serves on the Board of Directors for the Georgia Coalition Against Domestic Violence (GCADV) and works on the Justice for Incarcerated Survivors (JFIS) project run by the GCADV.
