

Danielle O'Connor

Special Agent Danielle O'Connor is currently assigned to the Human Exploitation and Trafficking Unit of the Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI). From June 2019 to July 2020, Agent O'Connor served with GBI's Child Exploitation and Computer Crimes Unit (CEACC) where she conducted undercover investigations involving violent crimes against children. These investigations include possessing/distributing/manufacturing child pornography, soliciting minors via the Internet, and the commercial sexual exploitation of children. One investigation Agent O'Connor led resulted in the indictment of eight members of the Inglewood criminal street gang for trafficking a person for the purpose of sexual servitude, rape, and violation of criminal street gang act.

Agent O'Connor was assigned to the GBI Region 12 Office from October 2015 through May 2019 and the GBI Region 4 Office from July 2012 through September 2015. During these assignments, she worked homicide, armed robbery, child abuse/molestation, aggravated assault, and rape cases, as well as serving as the child abuse specialist.

Before becoming a Special Agent, Agent O'Connor was a Conservation Ranger with the Georgia Department of Natural Resources Law Enforcement Division.

Agent O'Connor holds an Associate Degree from East Georgia College and a Bachelor's Degree from Troy University. She is a certified Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) general instructor and specialized instructor in Defensive Tactics and Emergency Vehicle Operations (EVOC). Agent O'Connor is also certified in child forensic interviews through ChildFirst Georgia.
