Faythe Kadona is a Survivor Leader/Office Manager with Street Grace. She is a certified facilitator with Ending the Game. She is the first woman in Georgia to be a licensed contract facilitator for TYRO and currently teaches women the TYRO Mom's leadership program and how to overcome incarceration to integrate back into their family units. Faythe also serves as the Survivor Mentor Program Coordinator for the Chatham County H.O.P.E. Court.

Faythe has helped draft key legislation, along with the Survivor Advisory Board, to assist survivors in getting their records restricted. This passed under SB435 in 2019 and the Name Change bill SB 34 in 2021. She also serves with Atlanta Redemption Ink on appointments with survivors of self-harm and branding cover-ups and was recently inducted into the National Society of Leadership and Success.

As someone with the lived experience in the field of human trafficking, addiction, and domestic violence who keeps God at the center of life, Faythe also serves as the chair of the Street Grace Survivor Advisory Board and certified in Trauma-Informed care for youth and adults.

Faythe has a Bachelor's degree in business and just finished her Master of Science/ Administration of Justice and Security.
