TEACHING TIPS How You Effectively Lead a Small Group Discussion

What are some of the challenges you have faced when leading a small group?

Aim: to discover some of the challenges our leaders face when leading a group discussion.

You must **come prepared to lead** a small group discussion.

- What are some things that stood out to you about being prepared?

 Aim for this question: Leaders must take the time to prepare for a good discussion.

 What are some things you need to do to change to be better prepared?
- What contributes to a good discussion of the truth? Aims for this question:

Leaders must know the goal, which is applying the word. Leaders must adopt a good method, not lecture but directed discussion to discovery. Learn to ask good questions: *how do you get better at this? What specific things can you do?*

• How can you help people apply the truth in concrete ways?

Aim: help leaders think through ways to ensure application of the truth.

Again, good questions, like:

What will you do this week about this?
What obstacle will you face in order to do this?
Share what *you* will do. Lead by example.
Ask follow up questions from the week before:
How did it go last week with your action step?

How to lovingly handle difficult people.

- When handling difficult people, what have you found to be the hardest thing to do?

 Aim: to discover what leaders find the most difficult, and discuss ways to overcome.
- Review: how to handle wrong answers, tough questions, rabbit trails, the person who dominates. Encourage them to review HFGL manual, appendix two.
