CURRENT RESEARCH

States' Adaptations to Business Compliance Processes in Response to the Pandemic

This research, supported by a grant from the PEW Charitable Trust, examines state regulatory process changes in response to safety concerns, economic and social hardships, and other circumstances created by COVID-19. The project also looks for evidence suggesting any long-term changes to state regulatory compliance processes. The project should wrap up in September.

Child Care and Workforce

On May 11, 2022, the CIP held a discussion on the ongoing workforce issues experienced by childcare providers in the US. Participants explored best practices, strategies, and solutions for helping the childcare industry recruit, retain, and support their staff.

 Association (APHSA), the National Association of Counties (NACo), and Monster Government Solutions were instrumental in bringing together a roundtable of state, local, nonprofit, and private sector organizations for the discussion.



Modern Social Services Delivery


On June 22, 2022, the CIP held its first in a planned series of meetings to discuss obstacles and strategies to streamline social service programs in the United States and identify the attributes of a modernized social services program. Sponsored by The Center for Accountability, Modernization, and Innovation (CAMI), the series focuses on social service programs designed and at least partially funded at the federal level and implemented at the state and local level. Feedback from this session sets up subsequent discussions of the practices needed to modernize the system and achieve programmatic outcomes.
